- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 256.39A SCHOOL-TO-WORK AND
- 2 CAREER PATHWAYS -- ASSESSMENT AND APPROPRIATION.
- A school district that assigns a weighting under
- 4 section 257.11, subsection 8, shall establish clearly defined,
- 5 measurable standards and shall annually use measurement
- 6 instruments to assess the development of student employability
- 7 skills. The school district shall provide the results of this
- 8 assessment to the department of education upon request.
- 9 2. There is appropriated for the fiscal year beginning
- 10 July 1, 1998, and each subsequent fiscal year from the general
- 11 fund of the state ten million dollars, or so much thereof as
- 12 is necessary, to the department of management to pay the

- 14 State aid paid under this section shall be paid in monthly

1 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 2 1999, the department of management shall pay supplementary aid 3 as provided in section 256.39A and section 257.11, subsection 4 8, on the basis of this additional enrollment. 5 Notwithstanding section 256.39A, subsection 1, a school 6 district is exempt from the requirements of section 256.39A 7 relating to measurement instruments and assessment results for 8 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 9 1999. The section of this Act relating 10 Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. It to initial year enrollment certification, being deemed of 12 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. 1.3 EXPLANATION This bill provides for an annual appropriation of \$10 14 15 million to pay foundation aid to school districts for high 16 school pupils participating in school-to-work or career 17 pathways programs. The bill assigns an additional weighting 18 of 0.2 of one pupil to those pupils. After the initial year 19 of funding, a school district that assigns such a weighting 20 must establish clearly defined, measurable standards and 21 annually use measurement instruments to assess the development 22 of student employability skills.
