A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing a medical expense fund for Persian Gulf
- Conflict veterans and their families, and making an
- 3 appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 135.16 PERSIAN GULF CONFLICT 2 MEDICAL EXPENSE FUND -- APPROPRIATION.
- 3 1. The department shall establish a fund to assist
- 4 veterans of the Persian Gulf Conflict, and their family
- 5 members, in defraying medical expenses relating to being
- 6 tested or treated for one or more illnesses commonly
- 7 associated with or referred to as gulf war syndrome. To be
- 8 eligible for assistance, an individual shall either be a
- 9 veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, as described in section
- 10 427.3, subsection 2, or a family member of such a veteran.
- 11 Individuals applying to the department for Persian Gulf
- 12 Conflict medical expense assistance shall document that the
- 13 individual is a Persian Gulf Conflict veteran or family
- 14 member, and that the individual has incurred medical expenses
- 15 relating to undergoing testing or treatment for illnesses
- 16 commonly associated with or referred to as gulf war syndrome.
- 17 The department shall determine criteria for the evaluation of
- 18 applications and the granting of assistance, subject to a
- 19 maximum award of five thousand dollars per applicant per year.
- 20 2. The department, with the assistance of the Iowa
- 21 national guard and the state and county commissions of
- 22 veterans affairs, shall develop and implement a notification
- 23 process encouraging Persian Gulf Conflict veterans and their
- 24 family members to be tested for illnesses related to service
- 25 in the Persian Gulf Conflict, and informing them of the
- 26 existence of the medical expense fund.
- 27 3. There is appropriated annually from the general fund of
- 28 the state to the department five hundred thousand dollars, or
- 29 so much thereof as is necessary, to carry out the purposes of
- 30 this section. Notwithstanding section 8.33, the moneys
- 31 appropriated in this section that remain unencumbered and
- 32 unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert
- 33 to the general fund but shall remain available for expenditure
- 34 for the purposes designated during the succeeding fiscal year.
- 35 EXPLANATION

This bill appropriates \$500,000 annually to the Iowa 2 department of public health for the creation of a medical 3 expense fund to assist veterans of the Persian Gulf Conflict 4 and their family members in defraying medical expenses 5 relating to being tested or treated for one or more illnesses 6 commonly associated with or referred to as gulf war syndrome. 7 Applicants for funds must document that they are a veteran of 8 the Persian Gulf Conflict, as described in Code section 427.3, 9 subsection 2, relating to property tax exemption 10 qualification, or a family member of such a veteran, and that 11 they have incurred medical expenses relating to testing or 12 treatment for illnesses associated with or referred to as gulf 13 war syndrome. Award criteria and funding amounts shall be 14 determined by the department, subject to a maximum award of 15 \$5,000 per applicant per year. The bill provides that the 16 department, with the assistance of the Iowa national guard and 17 the state and county commissions of veterans affairs, shall 18 develop and implement a notification process encouraging 19 Persian Gulf Conflict veterans and their family members to be 20 tested for illnesses related to service in the Persian Gulf 21 Conflict, and informing the veterans and their family members 22 of the existence of the medical expense fund. 23 additionally provides that the appropriated funds remaining 24 unencumbered and unobligated at the close of the fiscal year 25 shall not revert to the state general fund but shall remain 26 available for expenditure for the purposes designated during 27 the succeeding fiscal year. 28 29 30

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
