- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 257.13 ON-TIME FUNDING FOR NEW 2 STUDENTS.
- If a district's actual enrollment for the budget year,
- 4 determined under section 257.6, is greater than its budget
- 5 enrollment for the budget year, the district may submit a
- 6 request to the school budget review committee for on-time
- 7 funding for new students. The school budget review committee
- 8 shall consider the relative increase in enrollment on a
- 9 district-by-district basis, in determining whether to approve
- 10 the request, and shall determine the amount of additional
- 11 funding to be provided if the request is granted. An
- 12 application for on-time funding must be received by the
- 13 department of education by October 1. Written notice of the
- 14 committee's decision shall be given through the department of
- 15 education to the school board for a district.
- 16 2. If the school budget review committee approves a
- 17 request for on-time funding for new students, the funding
- 18 shall be in an amount up to the product of one-third of the
- 19 state cost per pupil for the budget year multiplied by the
- 20 difference between the actual enrollment for the budget year
- 21 and the budget enrollment for the budget year. The additional
- 22 funding received under this section is miscellaneous income to
- 23 the district.
- 3. There is appropriated each fiscal year from the general
- 25 fund of the state to the department of education up to six
- 26 million dollars to pay additional funding authorized under
- 27 this section, which shall be paid to school districts in
- 28 monthly installments beginning on December 15 and ending on
- 29 June 15 of a budget year. If the requests approved by the
- 30 school budget review committee exceed the appropriation in
- 31 this subsection, the payments to school districts receiving
- 32 approval for on-time funding shall be prorated such that each
- 33 school district approved for on-time funding shall receive an
- 34 amount of on-time funding equal to the percentage that the on-
- 35 time funding to be provided to the district bears to the total

- 1 amount of on-time funding to be provided to all districts
  2 receiving approval.
- 4. If the board of directors of a school district4 determines that a need exists for additional funds exceeding
- 5 the amount provided in this section, a request for
- 6 supplemental aid based upon increased enrollment may be
- 7 submitted to the school budget review committee as provided in
- 8 section 257.31.
- 9 5. A school district which is receiving a budget
- 10 adjustment for a budget year pursuant to section 257.14 shall
- ll not be eligible to receive on-time funding for new students
- 12 for that budget year.
- 13 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
- 14 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment for the
- 15 purpose of computations required for payment of state aid to
- 16 school districts for budget years beginning on or after July
- 17 1, 1998. This Act remains in effect until the repeal of
- 18 chapter 257 on July 1, 2001.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- 20 This bill provides that school districts experiencing
- 21 increases in enrollment may submit a request to the school
- 22 budget review committee for on-time funding for new students
- 23 by October 1 annually. The school budget review committee
- 24 shall determine whether, and to what extent, a request shall
- 25 be granted on a district-by-district basis. If a request is
- 26 approved, the funding shall be in an amount of up to the
- 27 product of one-third of the state cost per pupil for the
- 28 budget year multiplied by the difference between the actual
- 29 enrollment for the budget year and the budget enrollment for
- 30 the budget year.
- 31 The bill makes an appropriation from the general fund of
- 32 the state to the department of education of up to \$6 million
- 33 annually, payable in installments to school districts
- 34 beginning on December 15 and ending on June 15 of a budget
- 35 year. If requests for on-time funding exceed the

l appropriation available, school districts with approved 2 requests shall receive prorated payments. School districts 3 may request supplemental and above and beyond amounts received 4 for on-time funding pursuant to Code section 257.31. The bill 5 would become law upon enactment and remains in effect until 6 the repeal of Code chapter 257 on July 1, 2001.
