A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the membership of a joint 911 service board.
2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 34A.3, subsection 1, unnumbered 2 paragraph 1, Code 1097, is amended to read as follows: The board of supervisors of each county shall establish a 4 joint 911 service boss 1 net-later-them-danuary-17-1989. 5 political subdivision of the state having a public safety 6 agency-serving-territory within the county is entitled to 7 voting membership on the joint 911 service board. Each 8 private public safety agency operating within the area is 9 entitled to nonveting voting membership on the board. A 10 township-which-does med-operate-ite-own-patific-safety-agency-11 but-contracts Each givate safety agency under contract with a 12 political subdivision within the county for the provision of 13 public safety services, is not entitled to membership on the 14 joint-971-service-board,-but-ite-contractor-is-entitted-to 15 membership-accepteing-to-the-contractoris-status-as-a-public-or 16 private-safety-agency is entitled to voting membership on the 17 board. The board of supervisors of the county establishing 18 the board is also entitled to voting membership on the board. 19 The joint 911 service board shall develop an enhanced 911 20 service plan encompassing at minimum the entire county, unless 21 an exemption is granted by the administrator permitting a 22 smaller E911 service area. The administrator may grant a 23 discretionary exemption from the single county minimum service 24 area requirement based upon an E911 joint service board's or 25 other E911 service plan operating authority's presentation of 26 evidence which supports the requested exemption if the 27 administrator finds that local conditions make adherence to 28 the minimum standard unreasonable or technically infeasible, 29 and that the purposes of this chapter would be furthered by 30 granting an exemption. The minimum size requirement is 31 intended to prevent unnecessary duplication of public safety 32 answering points and minimize other administrative, personnel, 33 and equipment expenses. An E911 service area must encompass a 34 geographically contiguous area. No exemption shall be granted 35 from the contiguous area requirement. The administrator may

1 order the inclusion of a specific territory in an adjoining 2 E911 service plan area to avoid the creation by exclusion of a 3 territory smaller than a single county not serviced by 4 surrounding E911 service plan areas upon request of the joint 5 911 service board representing the territory. The E911 6 service plan operating authority shall submit the plan on or 7 before January 1, 1994, to all of the following: EXPLANATION This bill amends the membership of the 911 service board Ç 10 established in each county. The bill provides that each ll political subdivision, each public safety agency in the 12 county, each private safety agency under contract with a 13 political subdivision within the county, and the board of 14 supervisors is entitled to voting membership on the board. Currently, each political subdivision having a public 16 safety agency serving territory within the county is entitled 17 to a voting membership and each private safety agency is 18 entitled to a nonvoting membership. A township which does not 19 operate its own public safety agency, but contracts for such 20 services, is not entitled to membership on the board, but the 21 contractor is entitled to membership according to the 22 contractor's status as a public or private safety agency. 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34

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
