## A BILL FOR

1 An Act abolishing the county compensation board.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 331.212, subsection 2, Code 1997, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. i. Setting the compensation schedule of
- 4 the elected county officers.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 331.321, subsection 1, paragraph n, Code
- 6 1997, is amended by striking the paragraph.
- 7 Sec. 3. Section 331.322, subsection 6, Code 1997, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 6. Review Annually review and prepare the final
- 10 compensation schedule of-the-county-compensation-board-and
- 11 determine-the-final-compensation-schedule in accordance with
- 12 section 331.907.
- 13 Sec. 4. Section 331.322, subsection 7, Code 1997, is
- 14 amended by striking the subsection.
- 15 Sec. 5. Section 331.323, subsection 1, unnumbered
- 16 paragraph 5, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- When If the duties of an officer or employee are assigned
- 18 to one or more elected officers, the board shall set the
- 19 initial salary for each elected officer -- Thereafter, -the
- 20 satary-shall-be-determined as provided in section 331.907.
- 21 Sec. 6. Section 331.907, subsections 1 and 2, Code 1997,
- 22 are amended to read as follows:
- 23 1. The annual compensation of the auditor, treasurer,
- 24 recorder, sheriff, county attorney, and supervisors shall be
- 25 determined as provided in this section. The county
- 26 compensation board of supervisors annually shall review the
- 27 compensation paid to comparable officers in other counties of
- 28 this state, other states, private enterprise, and the federal
- 29 government. In setting the salary of the county sheriff, the
- 30 county-compensation board shall consider setting the sheriff's
- 31 salary so that it is comparable to salaries paid to
- 32 professional law enforcement administrators and command
- 33 officers of the Iowa highway safety patrol, the division of
- 34 criminal investigation of the department of public safety, and
- 35 city police agencies in this state. The county-compensation

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l board shall prepare a compensation schedule for the elective
 2 county officers for the succeeding fiscal year. A recommended
 3 compensation schedule requires a majority vote of the
 4 membership of the county-compensation board.
      At the public hearing held on the county budget as
 6 provided in section 331.434, the county-compensation board
 7 shall submit its recommended compensation schedule for the
 8 next fiscal year to-the-board-of-supervisors for inclusion in
 9 the county budget. The-board-of-supervisors-shail-review-the
10 recommended-compensation-schedule-for-the-elected-county
11 officers-and-determine-the-final-compensation-schedule-which
12 shall-not-exceed-the-compensation-schedule-recommended-by-the
13 county-compensation-board. -- In-determining-the-final
14 compensation-schedule-if-the-board-of-supervisors-wishes-to
15 reduce-the-amount-of-the-recommended-compensation-schedule;
16 the-amount-of-salary-increase-proposed-for-each-elected-county
17 officer-shall-be-reduced-an-equal-percentage: A copy of the
18 final compensation schedule shall be filed with the county
19 budget at the office of the director of the department of
20 management. The final compensation schedule takes effect on
21 July 1 following its adoption by the board of supervisors.

                             EXPLANATION
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      This bill abolishes the county compensation board and
25 transfers to the board of supervisors the duty of setting the
26 compensation schedule for elective county officers.
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
