## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of a class size reduction 2 program, smaller class size infrastructure program, an 3 infrastructure scudy, and making an appropriation. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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7 shall hold a public hearing on the question of participation.
8 The board shall set forth its proposal, including the method 9 that will be used to fund the program, in a resolution and 10 shall publish the notice of the time and place of a public 11 hearing on the resolution. Notice of the time and place of I2 the public hearing shall be published not less than ten nor 13 more than twenty days before the public hearing in a newspaper 14 which is a newspaper of general circulation in the school 15 district. At the hearing, or no later than thirty days after 16 the date of the hearing, the board shall take action to adopt 17 a resolution to participate in the smaller class size
18 infrastructure program for a period not exceeding five years 20 the question of participation in the program for a period not 21 exceeding ten years to the registered voters of the school

22 district at the next regular school election or at a special
23 election. If the board submits the question at an election 24 and a majority of those voting on the question favors
25 participation in the program, the board shall adopt a 26 resolution io participate and certify the results of the 27 election to the department of management.

Section 1. NEW SECTION. 257.51 SMALLER CLASS SIZE INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM.

1. A smaller class size infrastructure program that provides additional funding for school districts is established. A board of directors that wishes to consider participating in the smaller class size infrastructure program shall publish the notice of the time and place of a public or to direct the county commissioner of ejections to submit
2. If the board does not provide for an election and adopts a resolution to participate in the smaller class size infrastructure program, the district shall participate in che smaller class size infrastructure program unless within twenty-eignt days following the action of the board, the secretary oE tine board receives a petition containing the required number of signatures, asking that an election be called to age cove or disapprove the action os che board in
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1 adopting the smaller class size infrastructure program. The 2 petition must be signed by eligible electors equal in number 3 to not less than one hundred or thirty percent of the number 4 of voters at the last preceding regular school election, 5 whichever is greater. The board shall either rescind its
6 action or direct the county commissioner of elections to
7 submit the question to the registered voters of the school
$\varepsilon$ district at the next following regular school election or a
9 special election. If a majority of those voting on the 10 question at the election favors disapproval of the action of 11 the board, the district shall not participate in the smaller 22 ciass size infrastructure program. If a majority of those 13 voting on the question favors approval of the action, the 14 board shall certify the results of the election to the $i 5$ department of management and the district shall participate in 16 the program.

17 At the expiration of the twenty-eight day period, if no 18 petition is filed, the board shall certify its action to the 19 department of management and the district shall participate in 20 the program.
21 3. Participation in a smailer class size infrastructure 22 program is not affected by a change in the boundaries of the 23 school district, except as otherwise provided in this section. 24 If each school district involved in a school reorganization 25 under chapter 275 has approved a smaller class size 26 infrastructure program, and if the voters have not voted upon 27 the question of participation in the program in the 28 reorganized district, the smaller class size infrastructure 29 program shall be in effect for the reorganized district that 30 has been approved for the least amount and the shortest time 31 in any of the districts.
32 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 257.52 SMALLER CÜASS SIZE
33 INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING.
34 l. The additional funding for the smaller ciass size
35 infrastructure program for a budget year is limited to an
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amount not exceeding ten percent of the total of regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under section 257.14 as a budget adjustment for the budget year. Moneys received by a district for the smaller class size infrastructure program are miscellaneous income and may be used for any general fund purpose. However, moneys received by a district for the smaller class size infrastructure program shall be expended solely for smaller class size infrastructure needs.
2. Certification of a board's intent to participate for a budget year, the method of funding, and the amount to be raised shall be made to the department of management not later than April is of the base year. Funding for the smaller class size infrastructure program shail be obtained from smalier class size infrastructure state aid and from local funding using either a smalier class size infrastructure income surtax or a combination of a smaller class size infrastructure property tax and a smaller class size infrastructure income surtax as determined by the board of directors.
3. The smailer class size infrastructure income surtax shall fund at least sixiy percent of the local funding costs of the program. Subject to the limitation specified in section 298.14 , for each budget year the board shall determine the percent of income surtax that will be imposed, expressed as full percentage points, not to exceed twency percent.
4. For purposes of sections 257.51 through 257.60 , "smaller class size infrastructure", means those activities for which a school district is authorized to contract indebtedness and issue general obiigation bonds under section 296.l, except those activities related to a teacher's or superintendent's home or homes. The activities include the construction, reconstruction, repair, purchasing, or remodeiing of schoolhouses, stadiums, gyms, fieldiouses, and bus garages: and the procurement of schooinouse construccion sites and the making of site improvements. Aciditionaily,
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i "school infrastructure" includes the payment or retirement of
2 outstanding bonds previously issued for school infrastructure 3 purposes as described in this subsection, and the maintenance 4 of schoolhouses and school district property.

Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 257.53 SMALLER CLASS SLZE
6 YNFRASTRUCTURE STATE AID APPRORRIATION.
7 l. In order to determine the amount of smalier class size
8 infrastructure state aid and the amount of local funding for
9 the smaller class size infrastructure program for a district,
10 the department of management shall divide the total assessed
11 valuation in the state by the total budget enroliment for the
12 budget year in the state to determine a state assessed
13 valuation per pupil and shall divide the assessed valuation in
14 each district by the district's budget enroliment foi the
15 budget year to determine the district assessed valuation per
16 pupil. The department of management shall multiply the ratio
17 of the state's valuation per pupil to the district's valuation
18 per pupil by twenty-five hundredths and subtract that result
19 Erom one to determine the portion of the smaller class size
20 infrastructure program budget that is local funding. The
21 remaining portion of the budget shall be funded by smaller
22 class size infrastructure state aid.
23 2. There is appropriated for each fiscal year from the 24 generaj. fund of the state to the department of education, the 25 sum of twenty million dollars to pay smaller class size 26 infrastructure state aid as determined under subsection 2.

29 infrastructure state aid determined under subsection 1 , the 30 department of education shall prorate the amount of the $3 i$ smaller class size infrastructure state aid provided co each 32 district.
33 4. Smailer ciass size infrastructure state aiá sinali be 34 paid at the same time and in the same manner as foundation aid 35 is paid under section 257.16.
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1 2 SIZE INFRASTRUCTURE AMOUNT.

3 1. The department of management shall establish the amount 4 of smaller class size infrastructure property tax to be levied
5 and the amount of smaller class size infrastructure income
6 surtax to be imposed by a district in accordance with the
7 decision of the board under section 257.52 for each school
8 year for which the smaller class size infrastructure program
9 is authorized. The department of management shall determine
10 these amounts based upon the most recent figures available for
11 the district's valuation of taxable property, individual state
12 income tax paid, and budget enrollment in the district, and
13 shall certify to the district's county auditor the amount of
14 smaller class size infrastructure property tax if a smaller

Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 257.56 FORM AND TIME OF RETURN. The smaller ciass size infrastructure income surtax shall be made a part of the Iowa individual income tax return subject to the conditions and restrictions set forth in section 422.21.

Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 257.57 DEPOSIT OF SMALLER CLASS SIZE INFRASTRUCTURE INCCNE SURTAX.

9 l. The director of revenue and finance shall deposit all 10 moneys received as smaller class size infrastructure income 11 surtax to the credit of each district from which the moneys 12 are received, in the school district income surtax fund which 13 is established in section 298.14.

14 2. The director of revenue and finance shall deposit 15 smaller class size infrastructure income surtax moneys 16 received on or before November 1 of the year following the 17 close of the school budget year for which the surtax is 18 imposed to the credit of each district from which the moneys i9 are received in the school district income surtax fund. 20 3. Smaller class size infrastructure income surtax moneys 21 received or refunded after November 1 of the year following 22 the close of the school budget year for which the surtax is 23 imposed shall be deposited in or withdrawn from the general 24 fund of the state and shall be considered part of the cost of 25 26

27 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 257.58 SMALLER CLASS SIZE
28 INFRASTRUCTURE INCOME SURTAX CERTIFICATION.
29 On or before October 20 each year, the director of revenue 30 and $f$ inance shali make an accounting of the smalier ciass size

31 infrastructure income surtax collected under chis chapter
32 applicable to tax returns for the iast preceding calencar
33 year, or for a taxpayer's fiscal year ending durinc the second
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of the succeeding calendar year, from taxpayers in each school district in the state which has approved the smaller class size infrastructure program, and shall certify to the 4 department of management and the department of education the amount of total smaller class size infrastructure income surtax credited Erom the taxpayers of each school district.

12 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 257.60 CONTINUATION OF SMALLER
13 CLASS SIZE INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM.
14 I. At the expiration of the period for which the smaller $i 5$ class size infrastructure program was adopted, the program may 16 be extended for a period of not exceeding five or ten years in i7 the manner providec in section 257.51.
18 2. If the voters do not approve adoption of the smaller 19 class size infrastructure program, the board shall wait at 20 least one hundred twenty days following the election before

21 taking action to adopt the program or resubmit the
22 proposition.
23 Sec. il. NEW SECTION. 279.59 CLASS SIZE REDUCTION
24 PROGRAM.

1. There is established a class size reduction program to provide acicitional funds for school cistricts that develop a class size reducion plan. To be eligible for a ciass size reduction payment as provided in this section, a school district shall submit annually by Aprii 15 to the department of education a plan which includes, at a minimum, the goais of reducing ciass size in kindergacten through grade three and institut-ng professionai development co assist teacners in teaching chaiienging curricula more effectiveiy, the meinocis by whics the tistrict shail achieve those goais, and a process for engaging parents, teachers, school administrarors, and
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students in the shared goal of raising student achievement levels. In addition, the plan shall provide for methods for measuring student achievement and progress.
4 2. a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 5 state to the department of education for the fiscal year 6 beginning July 1,2998 , and ending June 30 , 1999, the sum of 7 sixteen million dollars to be used to fund school districts 8 that meet the requirements of subsection 1 and which limit the 9 district's self-contained grade one classroom sizes to an 10 average student-to-teacher ratio of not more than seventeen ii students to one teacher, or the equivalent, in a school that 12 utilizes team teaching methods.
13 b. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 14 state to the department of education for the fiscai year 15 beginning July 1,1999 , and ending June 30 , 2000, the sum of 16 thirty-two million dollars to be used to fund school districts 17 that meet the requirements of subsection 1 and which limit the 18 self-contained grade one and grade two classroom sizes to an 19 average student-to-teacher ratio of not more than seventeen 20 students to one teacher, or the equivalent, in a school that 21 utilizes team teaching methods.
22 c. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 23 state to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, and for succeeding years, the sum of forty-eight million dollars to be used to fund school districts that meet the requirements of subsection $l$ and which iimit the self-contained classroom sizes in grades one through three to an average student-toteacher ratio of not more than seventeen stuaents to one teacher, or the equivalent, in a schooi that ucilizes team teaching methods.
d. There is appropriated Erom the generai Euris of the Sicte to the deparment of education for the Eiscai year beginning Juiy 1,2001 , and ending June 30, 2002, anc io: succeeding years, the sum of sixty-four million doilars to de

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1 used to fund school districts that meet the requirements of 2 subsection 1 and which limit the self-contained classroom 3 sizes in kindergarten through grade three to an average 4 student-to-teacher ratio of not more than seventeen students 5 to one teacher, or the equivalent, in a school that utilizes 6 team teaching methods.

8 fiscal year in which moneys are appropriated, the amount of moneys allocated to school districts shall be in the
10 proportion that the basic enrollment for the budget year of
11 the grade level in the district for which the moneys are
12 appropriated bears to the sum of the basic enrollments for the
13 budget year of the grade level of all school districts in the
14 state qualifying for moneys under subsection 1 for the budget
15 year, as basic enrollment and budget year are defined in
16 chapter 257.

18 class size reduction program, the department of education
19 shall notify the department of revenue and finance of the
20 amount to be paid to each school district based upon the
$2 i$ distribution plan set forth for the appropriation made
22 pursuant to this section. The allocation to each school
23 district under this section shall be made in one payment on or
24 about October 1 of the fiscal year for which the appropriation

15 A school district income surtax fund is created in the

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school district infrastructure, which includes the above information, an inventory of school district infrastructure resources, fire and safety deficiencies, and any other data pertinent to the assessment and evaluation of the classroom environment and resources throughout the state. The department shall submit a report of its finaings and recommendations to the general assemibly by December 32, 1998.

## EXPLANATION

This bill establishes a smaller class size infrastructure program and a class size reduction program, appropriates moneys for purposes of the ciass size reduction program, and directs the department of education to conduct a study of the current statewide condition of public schooi infrastructure to determine the future infrastructure needs of public school districts.

The smaller class size infrastructure program created by the bill is similar to the instructional support program, except that the moneys received by a district for the smaller class size infrastructure program shall be expended solely for smaller class size infrastructure needs, which the bill defines. The bill provides that the smailer class size infrastructure income surtax must fund at least 60 percent of the cost of the program. The biil also includes a standing general fund appropriation of $\$ 20$ million to the department of education to pay smalier class size infrastructure state aid. If the appropriation is insufficient for the need, the amounts provided to districts shall be prorated.

The ciass size reduction program established wnder che biil provides additional funds for school districts that summit an annual plan to the department of education that includes, at a minimum, the goals of reducing ciass size in kindergarien and grades one chrough three and instituting professional development tc assist teachers in teaching challenging curricula more effectively, the methods by which ine district shall achieve those goals, and à process for engaging parents.
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i teachers, school administrators, and students in the shared 2 goal of raising student achievement ievels. In addition, the 3 plan shall provide for methods for measuring student
4 achievement and progress.
5 The bill appropriates $\$ 16$ million for grade one in the 6 fiscal year beginning Juiy i, 1998. The bill adds grade two

7 and another $\$ 16$ million in the fiscal year beginning July 1 ,
8 1999, adds grade chree and another $\$ 16$ million in Eiscal year
9 2000, and adds kindergarten and another $\$ 16$ million in fiscal 10 year 2001, to arrive at a total of $\$ 64$ million for the fiscal
11 year beginning July 1,2001 , and for all succeeding years.
12 The moneys allocated shall be distributed in the proportion
13 that the basic enroliment of the grade level in the district
14 for which the moneys are appropriated bears to the sum of the
15 basic enrollments of all school districts in the state for
16 that grade level qualifying for moneys for the budget year. 19 reduction plan.
