 2 1. Page 1, by striking lines 10 through 19 and
 3 inserting the following: "fund for the purposes of
 4 funding the following:
 5 a. Providers of emergency shelter services and
 6 support services to victims of domestic abuse or
 7 sexual assault pursuant to section 236.15 and for the
 8 award of funds to programs.
 9 b. Programs that provide services and support to
 10 victims of domestic abuse or sexual assault as
 11 provided in chapter 236.
 12 c. Programs of local anticrime organizations, as
 13 defined in section 910.1, to the extent that funds are
 14 available from federal defendants ordered to pay
 15 restitution under 18 U.S.C. § 3663(c)."
 16 2. By renumbering as necessary.

1 Section 1. Section 912.14, Code 1997, is amended to read
2 as follows:

3 912.14 VICTIM COMPENSATION FUND.

4 1. A victim compensation fund is established as a separate
5 fund in the state treasury.

6 2. Moneys deposited in the fund shall be administered by
7 the department and dedicated to and used for the purposes of
8 section 709.10 and this chapter.

9 3. In addition, the department may use moneys from the
10 fund for the following purposes of:

11 a. Funding providers of emergency shelter services and
12 support services to victims of domestic abuse or sexual
13 assault pursuant to section 236.15 and for the award of funds
14 to.

15 b. Funding programs that provide services and support to
16 victims of domestic abuse or sexual assault as provided in
17 chapter 236.

18 c. Funding programs of local anticrime organizations, as
19 defined in section 910.1.

20 4. Notwithstanding section 8.33, any balance in the fund
21 on June 30 of any fiscal year shall not revert to the general
22 fund of the state.

23 EXPLANATION

24 This bill adds programs run by local anticrime
25 organizations, defined in Code section 910.1, as entities
26 organized for the primary purpose of crime prevention which
27 have been officially recognized by the chief of police of the
28 city in which the organization is located or the sheriff of
29 the county in which the organization is located, as eligible
30 recipients of funds from the victim compensation fund
31 established in Code section 912.14.

32 The bill makes other technical changes to Code section
33 912.14.
