A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating federal funds made available from federal
 2 block grants and other federal grants, allocating portions of
 3 federal block grants, and providing procedures if federal
 4 funds are more or less than anticipated or if federal block
 5 grants are more or less than anticipated.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 2218

1 Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

2 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
3 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
4 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September
5 30, 1999, the following amount:

6 \$ 11,945,086

7 a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
8 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
9 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
10 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance
11 abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department
12 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
13 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
14 conformance with chapter 17A.

15 b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
16 not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for
17 administrative expenses.

18 c. The department shall expend no less than an amount
19 equal to the amount expended for treatment services in state
20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, for pregnant women and
21 women with dependent children.

22 d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
23 not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

24 e. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
25 not exceeding \$461,342 shall be used for current and former
26 recipients of federal supplemental security income (SSI).

27 2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in
28 subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

29 a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for
30 prevention programs.

31 b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
32 drug treatment and prevention activities.

33 c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
34 alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

35 3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the

1 federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated
 2 federal fiscal year 1998-1999 award appropriated in subsection
 3 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment
 4 programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that,
 5 based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess
 6 awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$1,000,000.

7 Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

8 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
 9 section 8.41 to the Iowa department of human services for the
 10 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending
 11 September 30, 1999, the following amount:

12 \$ 2,740,750

13 b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
 14 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
 15 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
 16 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the community
 17 mental health services block grant. The department shall
 18 expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided
 19 in the federal law making the funds available and in
 20 conformance with chapter 17A.

21 c. The administrator of the division of mental health and
 22 developmental disabilities shall allocate not less than 95
 23 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community
 24 mental health services providers for carrying out the plan
 25 submitted to and approved by the federal substance abuse and
 26 mental health services administration for the fiscal year
 27 involved.

28 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
 29 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department
 30 of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds
 31 set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the
 32 division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall
 33 pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the
 34 cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
 35 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The

1 auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and
2 developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

3 Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

4 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
5 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
6 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September
7 30, 1999, the following amount:

8 \$ 6,888,880

9 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
10 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
11 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
12 subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health
13 services block grant. The department shall expend the funds
14 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
15 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
16 17A.

17 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
18 exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

19 Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by
20 the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect
21 costs.

22 2. An amount not exceeding \$150,000 of the funds
23 appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public
24 health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health
25 for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be
26 used for audits in subsection 1.

27 The departments of public health, human services, and
28 education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional
29 child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the
30 maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of
31 services to women and children.

32 3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds
33 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement
34 appropriations for maternal and child health programs within
35 the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds,

1 \$284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care
2 program.

3 b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds
4 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the
5 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of
6 the state board of regents for mobile and regional child
7 health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals
8 and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs
9 from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to
10 establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile
11 and regional child health specialty clinics.

12 4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer
13 the statewide maternal and child health program and the
14 crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional
15 child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities
16 to improve the health of low-income women and children and to
17 promote the welfare of children with actual or potential
18 handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance
19 with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social
20 Security Act.

21 Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES
22 APPROPRIATIONS.

23 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
24 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
25 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September
26 30, 1999, the following amount:

27 \$ 2,103,338

28 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
29 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
30 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A,
31 subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and
32 health services block grant. The department shall expend the
33 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
34 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
35 chapter 17A.

1 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
2 exceeding \$5,522 shall be used for audits.

3 2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific
4 amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award
5 shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and
6 for rape prevention education.

7 3. An amount not exceeding \$94,670 of the remaining funds
8 appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 shall be used by the Iowa
9 department of public health for administrative expenses in
10 addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

11 4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1,
12 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1
13 shall be used by the department for healthy people
14 2000/healthy Iowans 2000 program objectives, preventive health
15 advisory committee, and risk reduction services, including
16 nutrition programs, health incentive programs, chronic disease
17 services, emergency medical services, monitoring of the
18 fluoridation program and start-up fluoridation grants, and
19 acquired immune deficiency syndrome services. The moneys
20 specified in this subsection shall not be used by the
21 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics or by the state
22 hygienic laboratory for the funding of indirect costs. Of the
23 funds used by the department under this subsection, an amount
24 not exceeding \$90,000 shall be used for the monitoring of the
25 fluoridation program and for start-up fluoridation grants to
26 public water systems, and at least \$50,000 shall be used to
27 provide chlamydia testing.

28 Sec. 5. DRUG CONTROL AND SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM
29 APPROPRIATION.

30 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
31 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
32 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
33 beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the
34 following amount:

35 \$ 5,806,000

1 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
 2 funds to be received from the federal government for the
 3 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter
 4 V, which provides for the drug control and system improvement
 5 grant program. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention
 6 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
 7 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
 8 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

9 2. An amount not exceeding 7 percent of the funds
 10 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
 11 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
 12 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
 13 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
 14 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
 15 state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use
 16 and administration of the state's portion of the funds
 17 appropriated in subsection 1.

18 Sec. 6. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM
 19 APPROPRIATION.

20 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
 21 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
 22 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
 23 beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the
 24 following amount:

25 \$ 1,619,000

26 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
 27 funds to be received from the federal government for the
 28 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter
 29 XII-H, which provides for grants to combat violent crimes
 30 against women. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention
 31 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
 32 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
 33 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

34 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
 35 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug

1 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
2 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
3 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
4 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
5 the state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the
6 use and administration of the state's portion of the funds
7 appropriated in subsection 1.

8 Sec. 7. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT APPROPRIATION.

9 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
10 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
11 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
12 beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the
13 following amount:

14 \$ 382,106

15 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
16 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
17 designated federal fiscal year under the federal Omnibus
18 Consolidated Recissions and Appropriations Act of 1997, Pub.
19 L. No. 104-134, which provides for grants to reduce crime and
20 improve public safety. The drug enforcement and abuse
21 prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in
22 this subsection as provided in the federal law making the
23 funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

24 2. An amount not exceeding 3 percent of the funds
25 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
26 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
27 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
28 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
29 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
30 state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use
31 and administration of the state's portion of the funds
32 appropriated in subsection 1.

33 Sec. 8. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE
34 PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from
35 the fund created in section 3.41 to the office of the governor

1 for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
2 the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending
3 September 30, 1999, the following amount:

4 \$ 236,738

5 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
6 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
7 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 136,
8 which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs
9 in state and local correctional facilities. The drug
10 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the
11 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
12 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
13 chapter 17A.

14 Sec. 9. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

15 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
16 section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of
17 the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
18 beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the
19 following amount:

20 \$ 5,307,702

21 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
22 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
23 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106,
24 which provides for the community services block grant. The
25 division of community action agencies of the department of
26 human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this
27 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
28 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

29 b. The administrator of the division of community action
30 agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not
31 less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to
32 eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting
33 low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a
34 minimum allocation of not less than \$100,000. The minimum
35 allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds

1 from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds.
 2 The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty-
 3 level population in the area represented by the community
 4 action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level
 5 population in the state.

6 2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds
 7 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of
 8 community action agencies of the department of human rights
 9 for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
 10 subsection for administrative expenses, the division of
 11 community action agencies of the department of human rights
 12 shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay
 13 the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
 14 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
 15 auditor of state shall bill the division of community action
 16 agencies for the costs of the audits.

17 Sec. 10. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

18 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 19 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal
 20 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September
 21 30, 1999, the following amount:

22 \$ 30,400,000

23 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 24 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 25 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69,
 26 which provides for community development block grants. The
 27 department of economic development shall expend the funds
 28 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
 29 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
 30 17A.

31 2. An amount not exceeding \$1,414,000 for the federal
 32 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, shall be used by the
 33 department of economic development for administrative expenses
 34 for the community development block grant. The total amount
 35 used for administrative expenses includes \$707,000 for the

1 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, of funds
 2 appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from
 3 the state equal to \$707,000 from the appropriation of state
 4 funds for the community development block grant and state
 5 appropriations for related activities of the department of
 6 economic development. From the funds set aside for
 7 administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of
 8 economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an
 9 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
 10 administration of the state's portion of the funds
 11 appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill
 12 the department for the costs of the audit.

13 Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

14 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 15 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the
 16 department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
 17 beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the
 18 following amount:

19 \$ 18,143,877

20 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 21 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 22 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94,
 23 subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy
 24 assistance block grants. The division of community action
 25 agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the
 26 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
 27 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
 28 chapter 17A.

29 2. An amount not exceeding \$1,542,229 or 10 percent of the
 30 funds appropriated in subsection 1, whichever is less, may be
 31 used for administrative expenses for the low-income home
 32 energy assistance program. Not more than \$290,000 shall be
 33 used for administrative expenses of the division of community
 34 action agencies of the department of human rights. From the
 35 total funds set aside in this subsection for administrative

1 expenses for the low-income home energy assistance program, an
2 amount sufficient to pay the cost of an audit of the use and
3 administration of the state's portion of the funds
4 appropriated is allocated for that purpose. The auditor of
5 state shall bill the division of community action agencies for
6 the costs of the audits.

7 3. The remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall
8 be allocated to help eligible households, as defined under 42
9 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet the costs of home
10 energy. After reserving a reasonable portion of the remaining
11 funds not to exceed 10 percent of the funds appropriated in
12 subsection 1, to carry forward into the federal fiscal year
13 beginning October 1, 1999, at least 15 percent of the funds
14 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for low-income
15 residential weatherization or other related home repairs for
16 low-income households. Of this amount, an amount not
17 exceeding 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

18 4. An eligible household must be willing to allow
19 residential weatherization or other related home repairs in
20 order to receive home energy assistance. If the eligible
21 household resides in rental property, the unwillingness of the
22 landlord to allow residential weatherization or other related
23 home repairs shall not prevent the household from receiving
24 home energy assistance.

25 5. Not more than 5 percent of the funds appropriated in
26 subsection 1 shall be used for assessment and resolution of
27 energy problems.

28 Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

29 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
30 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal
31 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September
32 30, 1999, the following amount:

33 \$ 24,727,375

34 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
35 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the

1 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
2 subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block
3 grant. The department of human services shall expend the
4 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
5 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
6 chapter 17A.

7 2. Not more than \$1,572,354 of the funds appropriated in
8 subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services
9 for general administration. From the funds set aside in this
10 subsection for general administration, the department of human
11 services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount
12 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
13 administration of the state's portion of the funds
14 appropriated in subsection 1.

15 3. In addition to the allocation for general
16 administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds
17 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the
18 following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal
19 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, for the following
20 programs within the department of human services:

- 21 a. Field operations:
- 22 \$ 9,404,423
- 23 b. Child and family services:
- 24 \$ 1,406,640
- 25 c. Local administrative costs
- 26 and other local services:
- 27 \$ 997,367
- 28 d. Volunteers:
- 29 \$ 109,002
- 30 e. Community-based services:
- 31 \$ 125,352
- 32 f. MH/MR/DD/BI community service (local purchase):
- 33 \$ 11,112,237

34 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
35 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop

1 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant
2 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

3 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services
4 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
5 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify
6 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to
7 fund the state programs and services.

8 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and
9 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social
10 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social
11 services block grant funds available for the local programs
12 and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal
13 social services block grant funds to the counties. The
14 proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will
15 be used to fund the local programs and services.

16 The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's
17 budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

18 Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM
19 HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from
20 the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health
21 administration to provide mental health services for the
22 homeless, the division of mental health and developmental
23 disabilities of the department of human services shall assure
24 that a project which receives funds under the formula grant
25 from either the federal or local match share of 25 percent in
26 order to provide outreach services to persons who are
27 chronically mentally ill and homeless or who are subject to a
28 significant probability of becoming homeless shall do all of
29 the following:

30 1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic
31 services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and
32 rehabilitation services.

33 2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary
34 hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health
35 services and substance abuse services.

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1 3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide
2 services to persons targeted by the grant.

3 4. Provide case management to homeless persons.

4 5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain
5 homeless persons living in residential settings which are not
6 otherwise supported.

7 6. Projects may expend funds for housing services
8 including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing,
9 security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance
10 in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing
11 services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless
12 individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental
13 payments to prevent eviction.

14 Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is
15 appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the
16 department of human services for the federal fiscal year
17 beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the
18 following amount:

19 \$ 26,452,639

20 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
21 anticipated to be received from the federal government under
22 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for
23 the child care and development fund. The department shall
24 expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in
25 the federal law making the funds available and in conformance
26 with chapter 17A.

27 Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

28 1. If the funds received from the federal government for
29 the block grants specified in this Act are less than the
30 amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be
31 prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than
32 for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape
33 prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this
34 Act, for which each block grant is available according to the
35 percentages that each program is to receive as specified in

1 this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds
2 allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect
3 the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation
4 is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the
5 funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent
6 possible the purposes of the various programs for which the
7 block grants are available.

8 2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for
9 in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

10 a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and
11 house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate
12 chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those
13 committees, the director of the legislative service bureau,
14 and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be
15 notified of the proposed action.

16 b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and
17 information on the reasons why particular percentages or
18 amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the
19 departments and programs affected, and other information
20 deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at
21 least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action
22 before the action is taken.

A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating federal funds made available from federal

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

2 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
3 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
4 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September
5 30, 1999, the following amount:

6 \$ 11,945,086

7 a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
8 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
9 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
10 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance
11 abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department
12 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
13 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
14 conformance with chapter 17A.

15 b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount

20 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
21 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
22 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94,
23 subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy
24 assistance block grants. The division of community action
25 agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the
26 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the

34 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
35 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop

1 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant
2 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

4 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
5 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify

APPROPRIATING FEDERAL FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE FROM FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS AND OTHER FEDERAL GRANTS, ALLOCATING PORTIONS OF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS, AND PROVIDING PROCEDURES IF FEDERAL FUNDS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED OR IF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 11,945,086

a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government

for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for administrative expenses.

c. The department shall expend no less than an amount equal to the amount expended for treatment services in state fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, for pregnant women and women with dependent children.

d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

e. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$461,342 shall be used for current and former recipients of federal supplemental security income (SSI).

2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for prevention programs.

b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on drug treatment and prevention activities.

c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated federal fiscal year 1998-1999 award appropriated in subsection 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that, based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$1,000,000.

Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 2,740,750

b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the community mental health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

c. The administrator of the division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall allocate not less than 95 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community mental health services providers for carrying out the plan submitted to and approved by the federal substance abuse and mental health services administration for the fiscal year involved.

2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 6,888,880

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect costs.

2. An amount not exceeding \$150,000 of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

The departments of public health, human services, and education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of services to women and children.

3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement appropriations for maternal and child health programs within the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds, \$284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care program.

b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of the state board of regents for mobile and regional child health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals

and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile and regional child health specialty clinics.

4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer the statewide maternal and child health program and the crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities to improve the health of low-income women and children and to promote the welfare of children with actual or potential handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social Security Act.

Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 2,103,338

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$5,522 shall be used for audits.

2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education.

3. An amount not exceeding \$94,670 of the remaining funds appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 shall be used by the Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1, 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department for healthy people 2000/healthy Iowans 2000 program objectives, preventive health advisory committee, and risk reduction services, including nutrition programs, health incentive programs, chronic disease services, emergency medical services, monitoring of the fluoridation program and start-up fluoridation grants, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome services. The moneys specified in this subsection shall not be used by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics or by the state hygienic laboratory for the funding of indirect costs. Of the funds used by the department under this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$90,000 shall be used for the monitoring of the fluoridation program and for start-up fluoridation grants to public water systems, and at least \$50,000 shall be used to provide chlamydia testing.

Sec. 5. DRUG CONTROL AND SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 5,806,000

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter V, which provides for the drug control and system improvement grant program. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this

subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding 7 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

Sec. 6. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 1,619,000

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter XII-H, which provides for grants to combat violent crimes against women. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of the state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

Sec. 7. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 382,106

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under the federal Omnibus Consolidated Recissions and Appropriations Act of 1997, Pub. L. No. 104-134, which provides for grants to reduce crime and improve public safety. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding 3 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

Sec. 8. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 236,738

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 136,

which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs in state and local correctional facilities. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Sec. 9. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 5,307,702

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106, which provides for the community services block grant. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. The administrator of the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a minimum allocation of not less than \$100,000. The minimum allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds. The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty-level population in the area represented by the community action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level population in the state.

2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of

community action agencies of the department of human rights for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the division of community action agencies for the costs of the audits.

Sec. 10. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 30,400,000

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69, which provides for community development block grants. The department of economic development shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding \$1,414,000 for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, shall be used by the department of economic development for administrative expenses for the community development block grant. The total amount used for administrative expenses includes \$707,000 for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, of funds appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from the state equal to \$707,000 from the appropriation of state funds for the community development block grant and state appropriations for related activities of the department of economic development. From the funds set aside for administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of

economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the department for the costs of the audit.

Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 18,143,877

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy assistance block grants. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding \$1,542,229 or 10 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, whichever is less, may be used for administrative expenses for the low-income home energy assistance program. Not more than \$290,000 shall be used for administrative expenses of the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights. From the total funds set aside in this subsection for administrative expenses for the low-income home energy assistance program, an amount sufficient to pay the cost of an audit of the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated is allocated for that purpose. The auditor of state shall bill the division of community action agencies for the costs of the audits.

3. The remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to help eligible households, as defined under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet the costs of home energy. After reserving a reasonable portion of the remaining funds not to exceed 10 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, to carry forward into the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, at least 15 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for low-income residential weatherization or other related home repairs for low-income households. Of this amount, an amount not exceeding 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

4. An eligible household must be willing to allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs in order to receive home energy assistance. If the eligible household resides in rental property, the unwillingness of the landlord to allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs shall not prevent the household from receiving home energy assistance.

5. Not more than 5 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for assessment and resolution of energy problems.

Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 24,727,375

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block grant. The department of human services shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. Not more than \$1,572,354 of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services for general administration. From the funds set aside in this subsection for general administration, the department of human services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

3. In addition to the allocation for general administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, for the following programs within the department of human services:

a. Field operations:	\$ 9,404,423
b. Child and family services:	\$ 1,406,640
c. Local administrative costs and other local services:	\$ 997,367
d. Volunteers:	\$ 109,002
e. Community-based services:	\$ 125,352
f. MH/MR/DD/BI community service (local purchase):	\$ 11,112,237

Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop a plan for the use of federal social services block grant funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

The proposed plan shall include all programs and services at the state level which the department proposes to fund with federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify state and other funds which the department proposes to use to fund the state programs and services.

The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and services which are eligible to be funded with federal social services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social services block grant funds available for the local programs and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal social services block grant funds to the counties. The proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will be used to fund the local programs and services.

The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health administration to provide mental health services for the homeless, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities of the department of human services shall assure that a project which receives funds under the formula grant from either the federal or local match share of 25 percent in order to provide outreach services to persons who are chronically mentally ill and homeless or who are subject to a significant probability of becoming homeless shall do all of the following:

1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and rehabilitation services.
2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health services and substance abuse services.
3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide services to persons targeted by the grant.
4. Provide case management to homeless persons.
5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain homeless persons living in residential settings which are not otherwise supported.

6. Projects may expend funds for housing services including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing, security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental payments to prevent eviction.

Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1998, and ending September 30, 1999, the following amount:

..... \$ 26,452,639

Funds appropriated in this section are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government under 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for the child care and development fund. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If the funds received from the federal government for the block grants specified in this Act are less than the amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this Act, for which each block grant is available according to the percentages that each program is to receive as specified in this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent possible the purposes of the various programs for which the block grants are available.

2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those committees, the director of the legislative service bureau, and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be notified of the proposed action.

b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and information on the reasons why particular percentages or amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the departments and programs affected, and other information deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action before the action is taken.

3. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act is less than the amount appropriated, the amount appropriated shall be reduced accordingly. An annual report listing any such appropriation reduction shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If funds received from the federal government in the form of block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, and 12 of this Act, the excess shall be prorated to the appropriate programs according to the percentages specified in those sections, except additional funds shall not be prorated for administrative expenses.

2. If funds received from the federal government from block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 11 of this Act for the low-income home energy assistance program, 15 percent of the excess shall be allocated to the low-income residential weatherization program.

3. If funds received from the federal government from community services block grants exceed the amount appropriated

in section 9 of this Act, 100 percent of the excess is allocated to the community services block grant program.

4. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act exceeds the amount appropriated, the excess amount is appropriated for the purpose designated in the specific grant's appropriation. An annual report listing any such excess appropriations shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 58. LIHEAP FUNDING -- DISCONNECTION PROHIBITION. It is the intent of the general assembly that if the governor determines federal funds are insufficient to adequately provide for certification of eligibility for the low-income home energy assistance program by the community action agencies during the federal fiscal year which commences October 1, 1998, the Iowa utilities board shall issue an order prohibiting disconnection of service from November 1 through April 1 by a regulated public utility furnishing gas or electricity to households whose income falls at or below one hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level as established by the United States office of management and budget. The board shall promptly adopt rules in accordance with section 17A.4, subsection 2, and section 17A.5, subsection 2, paragraph "b", to implement this requirement. electronic database. Rules adopted under this section shall also be published as a notice of intended action as provided in section 17A.4.
