A BILL FOR

1	An Act relating to the voluntary admission and release of persons	and and
2	suffering from dementia or a dementia-related illness to	
3	inpatient psychiatric treatment.	
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:	
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Section 1. Section 229.2, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows: An application for admission to a public or private hospital for observation, diagnosis, care, and treatment as a voluntary patient may be made by any person who is mentally ill or has symptoms of mental illness. <u>If a person is</u> <u>suffering from severe clinically diagnosed dementia or a</u> <u>severe dementia-related illness or exhibits symptoms of severe</u> <u>dementia or a severe dementia-related illness, an application</u> for inpatient psychiatric admission for observation, <u>li diagnosis, care, and treatment may be made by the person's</u> next of kin.

13 Sec. 2. Section 229.4, Code 1997, is amended by adding the 14 following new subsection:

15 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 1A. If the patient was admitted on 16 application by the patient's next of kin for inpatient 17 psychiatric observation, diagnosis, care, and treatment 18 because of severe dementia or a severe dementia-related 19 illness, and the request for release is made by the patient, 20 release may be conditioned upon the agreement of the next of 21 kin.

EXPLANATION

This bill provides that persons who are suffering from severe dementia or a dementia-related illness or exhibit symptoms of severe dementia may be voluntarily admitted to inpatient psychiatric care and treatment by the patient's next of kin. The release of the person who is suffering from severe dementia or a severe dementia-related illness and who has been voluntarily admitted for inpatient psychiatric care and treatment by the person's next of kin may be conditioned upon the agreement of the next of kin.

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
