A BILL FOR

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- 1 Section 1. Section 147.1, subsections 3 and 6, Code 1997,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 3. "Licensed" or "certified" when applied to a physician
- 4 and surgeon, podiatric physician, osteopath, osteopathic
- 5 physician and surgeon, physician assistant, psychologist or
- 6 associate psychologist, chiropractor, nurse, dentist, dental
- 7 hygienist, optometrist, speech pathologist, audiologist,
- 8 pharmacist, physical therapist, occupational therapist,
- 9 respiratory care practitioner, practitioner of cosmetology
- 10 arts and sciences, practitioner of barbering, funeral
- 11 director, dietitian, marital and family therapist, mental
- 12 health counselor, or social worker, or certified professional
- 13 midwife, means a person licensed under this subtitle,
- 14 excluding chapters 152C and 152D.
- 6. "Profession" means medicine and surgery, podiatry,
- 16 osteopathy, osteopathic medicine and surgery, practice as a
- 17 physician assistant, psychology, chiropractic, nursing,
- 18 dentistry, dental hygiene, optometry, speech pathology,
- 19 audiology, pharmacy, physical therapy, occupational therapy,
- 20 respiratory care, cosmetology arts and sciences, barbering,
- 21 mortuary science, marital and family therapy, mental health
- 22 counseling, social work, or dietetics, or certified
- 23 professional midwifery.
- Sec. 2. Section 147.13, Code 1997, is amended by adding
- 25 the following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 19. For certified professional midwifery,
- 27 certified professional midwife examiners.
- Sec. 3. Section 147.14, Code 1997, is amended by adding
- 29 the following new subsection:
- 30 NEW SUBSECTION. 17. For certified professional midwife
- 31 examiners, three members licensed as certified professional
- 32 midwives, one member who is a licensed physician practicing in
- 33 obstetrics or a licensed obstetrical nurse, and one member who
- 34 is not a licensed certified professional midwife or a licensed
- 35 physician or nurse who has received professional midwifery

- 1 services and who shall represent the general public.
- 2 Sec. 4. Section 147.74, Code 1997, is amended by adding
- 3 the following new subsection:
- 4 NEW SUBSECTION. 21. A certified professional midwife
- 5 licensed under chapter 154E may use the words "certified
- 6 professional midwife" or the initials "C.P.M." after the
- 7 person's name.
- 8 Sec. 5. Section 147.80, Code 1997, is amended by adding
- 9 the following new subsection:
- 10 NEW SUBSECTION. 25A. License to practice certified
- 11 professional midwifery upon the basis of an examination given
- 12 by the board of certified professional midwife examiners,
- 13 license to practice professional midwifery under a reciprocal
- 14 agreement, and renewal of a license to practice professional
- 15 midwifery.
- 16 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 154E.1 DEFINITIONS.
- 17 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 18 requires:
- 19 1. "Board" means the board of certified professional
- 20 midwife examiners established in section 147.13.
- 21 2. "Certified professional midwife" means a person who is
- 22 licensed to practice professional midwifery under chapter 147
- 23 and this chapter.
- 3. "Department" means the Iowa department of public health.
- 25 4. "Out-of-hospital" means any facility, institution, or
- 26 place which is not an ambulatory surgical center or a
- 27 hospital, such as a birth center as defined in section 135G.2
- 28 or a private home.
- 29 5. "Practice of certified professional midwifery" means the
- 30 provision of midwifery services including advising, attending,
- 31 or assisting a woman during pregnancy, labor, childbirth, or
- 32 the postpartum period by a person who is neither licensed to
- 33 practice medicine or surgery nor a nurse recognized by the
- 34 Iowa board of nursing as a certified nurse midwife, and who is
- 35 not rendering emergency services without compensation.

- 1 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 154E.2 LICENSURE -- CERTIFIED
- 2 PROFESSIONAL MIDWIFERY.
- 3 An applicant for a license to practice certified
- 4 professional midwifery shall be granted a license by the board
- 5 when the applicant satisfies all of the following
- 6 requirements:
- 7 1. Fulfills national certification requirements of the
- 8 North American registry of midwives or its successor
- 9 organization.
- 10 2. Has completed an apprenticeship period under the
- ll supervision of a certified professional midwife, or has
- 12 completed a course of instruction in midwifery, to be
- 13 established by the board and the department by rule.
- Passes an examination administered by the board.
- 15 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 154E.3 BOARD ORGANIZATION AND
- 16 AUTHORITY.
- 17 1. In addition to duties and responsibilities provided in
- 18 chapters 147 and 272C, the board and the department shall *
- 19 adopt rules relating to:
- 20 a. Standards required for persons engaging in the practice
- 21 of certified professional midwifery.
- 22 b. Standards for professional conduct of persons licensed
- 23 under this chapter.
- 24 c. The administration of this chapter.
- 25 d. The application of the certification requirements of
- 26 the North American registry of midwives or its successor
- 27 organization to criteria for licensure as a certified
- 28 professional midwife.
- 29 e. Procedures for the issuance, renewal, and removal of
- 30 persons licensed under this chapter based on qualifications,
- 31 standards, and scope of practice established by the North
- 32 American registry of midwives or its successor organization.
- 33 f. Apprenticeship and courses of instruction as provided
- 34 in section 154E.2.
- 35 g. The maintenance of a registry of certified professional

- 1 midwives and statistics on the practice of certified
- 2 professional midwifery utilizing vital statistics data.
- In establishing rules, the department and the board
- 4 shall consult with persons knowledgeable regarding the
- 5 prenatal and postpartum birth process, particularly those
- 6 possessing experience with out-of-hospital births, including
- 7 but not limited to physicians, certified professional
- 8 midwives, certified nurse midwives, and women who have given
- 9 birth in an out-of-hospital setting.
- 10 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. 154E.4 CLIENT DISCLOSURE
- 1. Prior to accepting a patient for certified professional
- 12 midwifery care, a certified professional midwife shall provide
- 13 information indicating all of the following:
- 14 a. Evidence that the care provider is a licensed certified
- 15 professional midwife meeting the requirements of this chapter.
- 16 b. The certified professional midwife's educational
- 17 background and relevant experience, including experience in
- 18 various birth settings.
- 19 c. The nature, scope, and location of the care to be
- 20 given, including the possibility of and the guidelines for
- 21 transfer of the patient, newborn child, or both, to a hospital
- 22 from an out-of-hospital setting.
- 23 d. The available alternatives to professional midwifery
- 24 care.
- 25 e. A description of the risks of birth in the birth
- 26 setting anticipated pursuant to the midwifery care, including
- 27 the conditions which could arise during the delivery requiring
- 28 a change of birth setting.
- 29 f. The fact that the client is advised to consult with a
- 30 physician at least twice during the pregnancy.
- 31 g. The distance in miles between the location at which the
- 32 midwifery services are proposed to be provided and the nearest
- 33 hospital or other appropriate medical facility.
- 34 h. Information concerning whether or not the certified
- 35 professional midwife has malpractice insurance and the extent

- 1 of coverage of such insurance.
- A certified professional midwife shall ensure that the
- 3 patient to receive midwifery services has signed a written
- 4 statement of informed consent containing at a minimum the
- 5 information required in subsection 1. The form and contents
- 6 of the statement shall be approved by the director of the
- 7 department.
- 8 3. A certified professional midwife and his or her client
- 9 shall prepare a written plan of action for continuity of care
- 10 throughout labor and delivery and to provide for the most
- 11 immediate care reasonably possible if an emergency arises.
- 12 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 154E.5 UNLAWFUL PRACTICE.
- 13 It shall be unlawful for any person licensed as a certified
- 14 professional midwife to attend any cases other than those of
- 15 routine childbirth, to perform any internal examinations or
- 16 manipulations of any kind, to prescribe medication, or to
- 17 perform any services of a licensed physician, physician
- 18 assistant, or nurse beyond the services specifically provided
- 19 in this chapter. In all cases in which a child is not
- 20 delivered spontaneously within a reasonable time, a certified
- 21 professional midwife shall notify a licensed and qualified
- 22 physician immediately and shall make no effort to deliver the
- 23 child except under the direction and supervision of a licensed
- 24 and qualified physician.
- 25 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 154E.6 EXCEPTIONS.
- 26 1. The practice of certified professional midwifery by a
- 27 certified professional midwife licensed pursuant to this
- 28 chapter shall constitute the licensed practice of midwifery
- 29 for purposes of the exception provided by chapters 147, 148,
- 30 150, and 150A of the Medical Practices Act.
- 31 2. The practice of certified professional midwifery by a
- 32 certified professional midwife licensed pursuant to this
- 33 chapter shall not constitute advanced registered nurse
- 34 practitioner care.
- 35 3. This chapter and chapter 147 do not prevent qualified

1 members of other professions, including physicians and nurses,

2 from providing services consistent with the nature of

3 certified professional midwifery, but these persons shall not

4 use a title or description denoting that they are certified

5 professional midwives.

EXPLANATION

7 This bill provides for the licensing of certified

8 professional midwives. The bill provides that the practice of

9 certified professional midwifery refers to the provision of

10 midwifery services including advising, attending, or assisting

11 a woman during pregnancy, labor, childbirth, or the postpartum

12 period by a person who is neither licensed to practice

13 medicine or surgery nor a nurse recognized by the Iowa board

14 of nursing as a certified nurse midwife, and who is not

15 rendering emergency services without compensation. An

16 applicant for a license to practice certified professional

17 midwifery shall fulfill national certification requirements of

18 the North American registry of midwives or its successor

19 organization, complete an apprenticeship period under the

20 supervision of a certified professional midwife, or complete a

21 course of instruction to be established by the Iowa department

22 of public health by rule, and pass an examination administered

23 by the board of certified professional midwife examiners.

24 The bill provides for the establishment of a board of

25 certified professional midwife examiners responsible for

26 establishing rules regarding the licensing and practice of

27 certified professional midwifery, and makes changes in Code

28 chapter 147 consistent with the establishment of the new

29 board. In establishing rules, the bill provides that the

30 board shall consult with persons knowledgeable regarding the

31 prenatal and postpartum birth process, particularly those

32 possessing experience with out-of-hospital births, including

33 but not limited to physicians, certified professional

34 midwives, certified nurse midwives, and women who have given

35 birth in an out-of-hospital setting. The bill provides that

1 information relating to the qualification and experience of 2 the certified professional midwife, the nature and scope of 3 the care to be provided, potential complications, and related 4 information shall be disclosed prior to accepting a patient 5 for certified professional midwifery care, and that a 6 certified professional midwife shall ensure that the patient 7 to receive midwifery services has signed a written statement 8 of informed consent. The bill also provides that a certified 9 professional midwife and his or her client shall prepare a 10 written plan of action for continuity of care throughout labor 11 and delivery and to provide for the most immediate care 12 reasonably possible if an emergency arises. The bill additionally provides that it shall be unlawful 13 14 for any person licensed as a certified professional midwife to 15 attend any cases other than those of normal childbirth, to 16 perform any internal examinations or manipulations of any 17 kind, to prescribe medication, or to perform any services of a 18 licensed physician, physician assistant, or nurse beyond the 19 services specifically provided in the bill. In all cases in 20 which a child is not delivered spontaneously within a 21 reasonable time, the bill provides that a certified 22 professional midwife shall notify a qualified physician 23 immediately and shall make no effort to deliver the child 24 except under the direction and supervision of a the physician. 25 The bill further provides that qualified members of other 26 professions, including physicians and nurses, are not 27 prevented from providing services consistent with the nature 28 of certified professional midwifery, but these persons shall 29 not use a title or description denoting that they are 30 certified professional midwives. 31 32
