- 32 This bill provides for the establishment of a state

- 34 are found to have outstanding cultural and natural values such
- 35 as scenic, forest, prairie, mineral, geological, historic,

l archaeological, recreational, educational, water quality, and

2 flood protection values. The state plan is to be prepared and

3 implemented by the natural resource commission of the

4 department of natural resources. The department is to

5 encourage participation by governing bodies of cities and

6 counties, county conservation boards, and individual

7 landowners.

8 The bill provides that the natural resources commission

9 establish procedures for identifying those areas of the Loess

10 Hills and bluffs in western Iowa which should be protected

11 from harmful uses and erosion. The protections may be

12 implemented by acquiring fee simple title from willing

13 sellers, conservation easements, or other agreements.

14 The bill also provides for reimbursement by the state for

15 losses of local tax property tax revenue due to the public:

16 acquisition of protected Loess Hills areas by purchase or

17 conservation easement or other leasing arrangements.

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
