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HOUSE FILE 2523 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for House File 2523 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2523 requires rural health clinics receive cost-based reimbursement for services provided under the Medical Assistance Program.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. Rural health clinics are currently reimbursed on a cost-based determination. There is no fiscal impact for these providers as a result of HF 2523 prior to FY 2004.
- 2. The federal Balanced Budget Act of 1997 phases out the requirement that rural health clinics be reimbursed 100.0% of their costs, requiring a minimum of 95.0% in FY 2000, 90.0% in FY 2001, 85.0% in FY 2002, and 70.0% in FY 2003. Subsequent to FY 2003, a federal minimum payment requirement is repealed. It is unknown what action the State of Iowa would have taken in response to the federal changes. Since HF 2523 does not specify 100.0% reimbursement, any of the federal minimums would be allowable subsequent to passage of HF 2523, as long as the reimbursement is "cost-based".

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to HF 2523 prior to FY 2004. The fiscal impact beyond FY 2004 is unknown.
