3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 258B.1 **STATEWIDE ENVIRONMENTAL** 2 EDUCATION STRATEGY.
- 3 1. It is in the interest of the citizens of Iowa that a
- 4 comprehensive environmental education initiative be undertaken
- 5 that will result in environmentally literate and responsible
- 6 citizens who will effectively and constructively solve
- 7 existing environmental problems, prevent new environmental
- 8 problems, and maintain a sustainable environment for future
- 9 Iowans. A healthy economy is intimately linked to a healthy
- 10 environment. The appropriate audiences for environmental
- 11 education include both formal and nonformal audiences,
- 12 business, labor, governments, nonprofit entities, and
- 13 citizens.
- 14 2. The goal of this initiative is to assure that Iowans
- 15 are environmentally literate. An environmentally literate
- 16 citizen is committed to lifelong learning and understands the
- 17 following:
- 18 a. Basic principles of ecology, sociology, and economics.
- 19 b. The interconnection of all parts of the environment.
- 20 c. The environmental and social costs and benefits of
- 21 consumer decisions.
- 22 d. Sources of energy, the improving of energy efficiency,
- 23 and the relationships between energy use and lifestyle.
- e. The implications of economic and population trends.
- 25 f. The impacts of personal life styles and personal
- 26 choices.
- 27 g. The importance of acting in a sustainable and
- 28 constructive manner to protect the quality and diversity of
- 29 the natural world.
- 30 3. An office of environmental education, an interagency
- 31 environmental education committee, state and county
- 32 environmental education plans, preschool-to-adult
- 33 environmental education programs, environmental education
- 34 assistance, and a grants program shall be established to
- 35 achieve the goal of accomplishing this initiative. For

- 1 purposes of this chapter, "nonformal education" means
- 2 education which takes place outside of the formal, educational
- 3 classroom setting.
- 4 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 258B.2 OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL
- 5 EDUCATION.
- 6 1. An office of environmental education is established and
- 7 administratively attached to the department of education. The
- 8 full-time supervisor of the office shall be an experienced
- 9 environmental educator. The office shall be staffed by
- 10 appropriately trained personnel.
- 11 2. The office of environmental education shall do all of
- 12 the following:
- 13 a. Develop and publish a plan for environmental education
- 14 with assistance from the interagency environmental education
- 15 committee.
- 16 b. Accept, review, and approve county plans for
- 17 environmental education and administer the allocation of funds
- 18 to the county conservation boards provided for under section
- 19 258B.5.
- 20 c. Assess the status of environmental literacy of the
- 21 state's students, teachers, and citizens every four years.
- d. Review the state's plan for environmental education
- 23 every four years with the assistance of the interagency
- 24 environmental education committee, revise the plan as needed,
- 25 and transmit the plan to the governor and the general
- 26 assembly.
- 27 e. Establish guidelines and specific criteria for the
- 28 grants program provided for in section 258B.4.
- 29 f. Administer the environmental education grants program.
- 30 q. Promote and aid in the establishment and evaluation of
- 31 school environmental education programs for preschool through
- 32 grade twelve.
- 33 h. Promote the development of environmental education
- 34 initiatives and programs for the adult population.
- 35 i. Cooperate with federal and state agencies and the

- 1 private sector in developing, promoting, and evaluating
- 2 environmental education programs.
- 3 j. Promote the development of cooperative environmental
- 4 education initiatives with the private sector.
- 5 k. Facilitate and encourage formal and nonformal
- 6 environmental education programs; facilitate, encourage, and
- 7 support multi-school districts' cooperative efforts to assess
- 8 the need for, develop, and evaluate environmental education
- 9 curricula, promote state government and private sector policy
- 10 that is consistent with the environmental education plan
- 11 established in this legislation, and assist in the
- 12 coordination of formal and nonformal environmental education
- 13 with the kindergarten through grade twelve and postsecondary
- 14 environmental education programs.
- 15 1. Initiate research on environmental education as called
- 16 for in the environmental education plan by issuing contracts
- 17 to organizations, colleges, universities, and other research-
- 18 based institutions.
- 19 m. Coordinate environmental education conferences to
- 20 assist in the dissemination, development, and achievement of
- 21 the state's environmental education plan.
- 22 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 258B.3 INTERAGENCY ENVIRONMENTAL
- 23 EDUCATION COMMITTEE.
- 24 1. An interagency environmental education committee is
- 25 established. The committee shall be composed of individuals
- 26 with knowledge in environmental education and the members
- 27 shall be employees appointed by each agency head. These
- 28 agencies may include, but are not necessarily limited to, the
- 29 departments of agriculture and land stewardship, cultural
- 30 affairs, education, economic development, human services,
- 31 natural resources, public health, and transportation, the
- 32 state board of regents, and the attorney general's office.
- 33 The chair shall be elected by the members.
- 34 2. Members of the committee shall serve as environmental
- 35 education coordinators for their respective agencies. They

- 1 shall direct an assessment of their own agency's target
- 2 audiences and develop appropriate programs to educate these
- 3 audiences regarding environmental issues. The committee shall
- 4 establish subcommittees as needed and assist with the
- 5 development and implementation of the state's environmental
- 6 education plan.
- 7 3. The committee shall develop and maintain a memorandum
- 8 of understanding to specify methods by which the agencies can
- 9 share their resources to benefit environmental education in
- 10 the state.
- 11 4. The committee shall promote networking, coordination,
- 12 and cooperation among state agencies, promote the efficient
- 13 distribution of information, and facilitate the planning and
- 14 development of educational programs and materials. The
- 15 department of education is responsible for convening and
- 16 facilitating the functions of the committee.
- 17 5. Members of the committee are not eligible to receive
- 18 any separate compensation and are not eligible for
- 19 reimbursement of expenses from the committee.
- 20 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 258B.4 GRANTS PROGRAM.
- 21 An environmental education grants program is established in
- 22 order to accomplish the goals set forth in section 258B.1.
- 23 Guidelines established by the office of environmental
- 24 education shall include, but are not limited to, a requirement
- 25 that grant proposals conform with county and state
- 26 environmental education plans. The department of education
- 27 shall administer the environmental education grant program. A
- 28 grant proposal affecting a single county shall be submitted to
- 29 and receive the approval of that county's environmental
- 30 education committee prior to submission to the department of
- 31 education. A grant proposal affecting more than one county or
- 32 the entire state shall be submitted directly to the department
- 33 of education.
- 34 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 2588.5 ASSISTANCE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL
- 35 EDUCATION -- APPROPRIATION.

- 1 l. Financial assistance shall be administered by the
- 2 office of environmental education of the department of
- 3 education, and shall be provided to county conservation boards
- 4 to support the hiring of professional environmental educators
- 5 to assist schools and nonformal education sectors in planning
- 6 and leading environmental education programs. The financial
- 7 assistance shall be used to provide staff and equipment for
- 8 these programs and shall not be used for the construction or
- 9 maintenance of parks, buildings, or other physical facilities.
- 10 The financial assistance shall not replace existing county
- 11 moneys budgeted for environmental education. Financial
- 12 assistance shall be provided as follows:
- a. Within thirty days of receipt of a county conservation
- 14 board's environmental education plan, pursuant to subsection
- 15 2, the sum of ten thousand one hundred dollars shall be
- 16 allocated to the county conservation board for use in
- 17 implementing the board's environmental education plan. One
- 18 million one hundred thousand dollars shall be divided among
- 19 eligible counties on a population-based formula detailed in
- 20 paragraphs "b" through "d".
- 21 b. A county shall be declared eligible if the county
- 22 submits certification that the county will do both of the
- 23 following:
- 24 (1) Provide county funding or support equivalent to one
- 25 cent per thousand dollars of the assessed value of taxable
- 26 property in the county or thirty-five thousand dollars,
- 27 whichever is less, according to a formula outlined in
- 28 paragraph "c", for environmental education.
- 29 (2) Explain how the financial assistance will be spent for
- 30 environmental education.
- 31 c. In order to meet county funding or support
- 32 requirements, county conservation boards may include the
- 33 dollar equivalent of the following county support:
- (1) Salaries and benefits for all full-time and part-time
- 35 naturalists, environmental education coordinators,

- 1 environmental program specialists, and other positions whose
- 2 responsibilities lie solely within the county conservation
- 3 board's environmental education program.
- 4 (2) For staff positions involving some responsibilities
- 5 outside the environmental education program, such as a ranger,
- 6 a percentage of the salary and benefits equal to that portion
- 7 of time devoted specifically to the environmental education
- 8 program.
- 9 (3) Operation and maintenance, but not purchase, of a
- 10 county vehicle designated to be used specifically by the
- 11 environmental education program staff.
- 12 (4) Funds budgeted specifically for the environmental
- 13 education program, including, but not limited to: program
- 14 supplies, office supplies, telephone and communications,
- 15 uniforms, newsletters and other public relations tools,
- 16 publicity, library and resource materials, printing or
- 17 purchase of environmental and conservation education resource
- 18 materials, travel, and professional development workshops and
- 19 conferences.
- 20 The costs of construction or maintenance of parks,
- 21 buildings, or any physical facilities shall not be used to
- 22 meet the county funding or support requirements.
- d. Counties declared eligible shall receive financial
- 24 assistance under this section according to the following
- 25 formula: official population figure of the county according
- 26 to the most recent federal decennial census times forty cents.
- 27 e. In order to fulfill the county funding or support
- 28 requirements of this section, county conservation boards may
- 29 contract with private nature centers, camps, or other private
- 30 or public entities to provide these environmental education
- 31 services. The boards shall submit an annual report to the
- 32 office of environmental education demonstrating and certifying
- 33 the proper use of these funds.
- f. The focus of this financial assistance shall be, but is
- 35 not limited to: helping teachers, group leaders, and other

- 1 environmental educators to plan, develop, and implement
- 2 environmental education programs, including leading outdoor
- 3 environmental education classes for all ages and for both
- 4 formal and nonformal educational groups; providing program
- 5 resources such as environmental education activity guides and
- 6 curricula, learning kits, audiovisual materials, literature,
- 7 and equipment; and interpreting Iowa's natural and cultural
- 8 resources and how to use them wisely.
- 9 2. To receive funds under this section, a county shall
- 10 establish a county environmental education committee. The
- 11 county conservation board shall be responsible for the
- 12 establishment and membership of the committee. Members shall
- 13 include, but are not limited to, representatives from soil and
- 14 water conservation districts, local schools, conservation
- 15 groups, and business and industry groups with established
- 16 interests in environmental education. Responsibilities of the
- 17 committee shall include, but are not limited to, the
- 18 following:
- 19 a. Establishing operating rules for the committee.
- 20 b. Developing and submitting to the county conservation
- 21 board annual eligibility reports.
- 22 c. Developing and submitting the county environmental
- 23 education plan to the office of environmental education. The
- 24 plan shall include, but is not limited to, all of the
- 25 following:
- 26 (1) Long-term goals for environmental education in the
- 27 county and an outline of the relationship of the plan to the
- 28 goal of achieving environmental literacy.
- 29 (2) A description of the manner in which the plan utilizes
- 30 existing professional environmental education personnel,
- 31 programs, and facilities.
- 32 (3) An outline of the resources needed to achieve plan
- 33 goals, including sufficient professional educators to meet a
- 34 target of one full-time equivalent environmental educator for
- 35 every three thousand to four thousand kindergarten through

- 1 grade twelve students in the county.
- 2 (4) Letters of support for the plan from the members of
- 3 the county environmental education committee.
- 4 The plan shall be reviewed and accordingly revised every
- 5 four years in coordination with a state assessment of
- 6 environmental literacy provided for in section 258B.2.
- 7 d. Facilitating communication among all parties active in
- 8 environmental education in the county to maximize the use of
- 9 local resources.
- 10 e. Reviewing and commenting on grants proposals submitted
- 11 to the office of environmental education pursuant to section
- 12 258B.4.
- 13 3. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
- 14 state to the department of education for each fiscal year the
- 15 sum of one million dollars for the purpose of providing
- 16 financial assistance for environmental education as provided
- 17 in subsection 1.
- 18 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 258B.6 RESIDENTIAL ENVIRONMENTAL
- 19 EDUCATION PROGRAMS -- APPROPRIATION.
- 20 1. A residential environmental education program is
- 21 created to recognize the critical role that both direct
- 22 experience with the outdoors and a several-day residential
- 23 experience away from the home and formal school environment
- 24 play in the formation of an environmentally literate
- 25 citizenry.
- 26 2. Phase I of the program shall provide supplemental
- 27 funding of thirty-five dollars per pupil to school districts
- 28 that choose to provide for the attendance of the pupils in one
- 29 grade level at a certified residential environmental education
- 30 center. To receive this funding, school districts must
- 31 provide proof of attendance by their pupils at such a center
- 32 and participation by pupils in a certified program for a
- 33 minimum of two consecutive days for each pupil. In addition,
- 34 school districts shall submit evidence of matching
- 35 contributions of at least fifty percent of the total program

- l cost. Local school districts shall choose the grade level and
- 2 the time of year they feel is most developmentally appropriate
- 3 for this residential experience.
- 4 3. Phase II of the program shall consist of all of the 5 following:
- 6 a. Development of certification criteria for facilities,
- 7 staff, and programs.
- 8 b. Census of existing facilities, staff, and programs
- 9 relative to the certification criteria.
- 10 c. Assessment of the needs of these facilities.
- 11 4. The program shall be administered by the office of
- 12 environmental education.
- 13 5. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
- 14 state to the department of education for each fiscal year, the
- 15 sum of three hundred fifty thousand dollars for the purposes
- 16 of phase I of the residential environmental education program
- 17 as provided in subsection 2.
- 18 Sec. 7. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. There is appropriated
- 19 from the general fund of the state to the department of
- 20 education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, and
- 21 ending June 30, 1998, the following amount, or so much thereof
- 22 as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:
- 23 OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION
- 24 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,
- 25 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent
- 26 positions:

29 EXPLANATION

- 30 This bill establishes an environmental education strategy
- 31 for the state of Iowa. The bill also establishes and funds a
- 32 state office of environmental education for all of Iowa's
- 33 citizens from preschoolers to adults. The office is
- 34 administratively attached to the department of education to
- 35 establish and coordinate a plan for the state. The office is

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1 to coordinate with federal and state agencies and the private 2 sector in developing and implementing environmental education 3 strategies. The bill appropriates \$600,000 from the general 4 fund to fund the office for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 5 1997. A grants program is also established to be administered 6 by the department of education. An interagency environmental education committee is 8 established to coordinate efforts among state agencies to 9 promote and assist in providing environmental education 10 programs in the state. An assistance program is established and the bill creates a-12 \$1 million standing appropriation to provide assistance for 13 county conservation boards. The bill provides a formula for 14 determining the eligibility of each county board. The bill also appropriates \$350,000 to reimburse a school 15 16 district on a per pupil basis when the school district permits 17 pupils from one grade level to spend two or more consecutive 18 days at a certified residential environmental education 19 center. 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 3.2 33 34

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
