- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 261.22 IOWA WINS SCHOLARSHIP
- 2 PROGRAM -- APPROPRIATION.
- Subject to an appropriation of sufficient funds by the
- 4 general assembly, there is established an Iowa wins
- 5 scholarship program to be administered by the college student
- 6 aid commission. A resident of this state who graduated, or
- 7 within one year will graduate, from an accredited secondary
- 8 school in this state and who has been admitted to or is
- 9 attending as a full-time or part-time student an institution
- 10 of higher education under the state board of regents, a
- 11 community college, an accredited private institution as
- 12 defined in section 261.9, subsection 1, or a postsecondary
- 13 institution that meets the requirements of chapter 261B, is
- 14 eligible for the following scholarship amounts:
- 15 a. Up to two thousand dollars if the person ranked in the
- 16 upper twenty-five percent of their secondary school class at
- 17 the end of grade twelve.
- 18 b. Up to one thousand dollars for all other graduates of
- 19 accredited secondary schools in this state.
- 20 2. By June 30 of the school year in which a student
- 21 completes grade twelve, each accredited public and nonpublic
- 22 secondary school in Iowa shall include in the student's
- 23 transcript the student's class percentile rank.
- 24 3. A person who meets the qualifications of subsection 1
- 25 may apply to the commission for an Iowa wins scholarship at
- 26 any time within one year following the person's graduation
- 27 from an accredited secondary school in this state. However,
- 28 once approved for a scholarship under this section, the person
- 29 may receive Iowa wins scholarship moneys for not more than
- 30 twelve months.
- 31 4. The amount of an Iowa wins scholarship shall not exceed
- 32 the total tuition and mandatory fees for attending a
- 33 postsecondary institution as provided in subsection 1.
- 34 5. Scholarship moneys may be awarded for full-time or
- 35 part-time study during the fall, spring, or summer semesters,

- l or the trimester or quarter equivalent.
- 2 6. The commission shall administer this program and shall3 do all of the following:
- 4 a. Provide application forms for distribution to students5 by Iowa high schools.
- b. Adopt rules for determining financial need, defining
 7 residence for the purposes of this section, and for processing
 8 and approving applications for scholarships.
- 9 c. Make an annual report to the governor and general 10 assembly.
- 7. Each applicant, in accordance with the rules
- 12 established by the commission, shall do all of the following:
- 13 a. Complete and file an application for an Iowa wins
- 14 scholarship.
- b. Report promptly to the commission any necessary
- 16 information requested by the commission.
- 17 8. If a recipient of scholarship moneys issued in
- 18 accordance with this section is dismissed or withdraws from
- 19 the postsecondary institution before completion of the term,
- 20 the award, or the portion of the award that conforms with that
- 21 institution's accepted policy of refunds, shall be refunded to
- 22 the commission.
- 23 9. There is appropriated annually from the general fund of
- 24 the state to the college student aid commission an amount
- 25 sufficient to carry out the provisions of this section.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- 27 This bill establishes the Iowa wins scholarship program for
- 28 residents who graduated from accredited Iowa high schools and
- 29 who have been admitted to or are attending an institution of
- 30 higher education under the state board of regents; a community
- 31 college; an accredited private institution; or a postsecondary
- 32 institution that meets the requirements of chapter 261B, which
- 33 requires certain schools to register with the secretary of
- 34 state. The bill creates a standing unlimited appropriation
- 35 from the general fund of the state to pay for the program.

A person who ranked in the upper 25 percent of their class 2 at the end of grade 12 is eligible for a scholarship of up to 3 \$2,000 and all other Iowa high school graduates are eligible 4 for a scholarship up to \$1,000.

By June 30 of the school year in which a student completes 6 grade 12, each accredited public and nonpublic secondary

7 school in Iowa is directed to include in each student's 8 transcript the student's class percentile rank.

9 A person may apply to the commission for an Iowa wins
10 scholarship at any time within one year following the person's
11 graduation from high school. However, once approved for a
12 scholarship under this section, the person may receive Iowa
13 wins scholarship moneys for not more than 12 months.

14 The amount of an Iowa wins scholarship shall not exceed the 15 total tuition and mandatory fees.

Scholarship moneys may be awarded for full-time or part-17 time study during the fall, spring, or summer semesters, or 18 the trimester or quarter equivalent.

19 If a recipient of Iowa wins scholarship moneys issued in 20 accordance with this section is dismissed or withdraws from 21 the postsecondary institution before completion of the term, 22 the award, or the portion of the award that conforms with that 23 institution's accepted policy of refunds, shall be refunded to 24 the commission.

The commission is directed, under the bill, to report annually to the governor and general assembly.
