A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to minors' drivers' licenses and operating privileges. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- Section 1. Section 321.182, Code 1997, is amended by
- 2 adding the following new subsections:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. Certify that the applicant, if a minor
- 4 who has not previously been issued a class Cl or class M1
- 5 motor vehicle license under section 321.189, subsection 1,
- 6 paragraph "f" or "g", meets the requirements for issuance of a
- 7 motor vehicle license under those paragraphs.
- 8 NEW SUBSECTION. 6. Certify that the applicant, if a minor
- 9 who has been operating a motor vehicle under a class Cl or
- 10 class Ml motor vehicle license, satisfies the criteria
- 11 necessary to be issued a regular motor vehicle license.
- 12 Sec. 2. Section 321.184, subsection 1, Code 1997, is
- 13 amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:
- 14 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The parent, quardian, or person
- 15 having custody of the applicant under chapter 600A shall also
- 16 verify that the person has supervised the applicant's driving
- 17 for the periods required by section 321.189, subsection 1,
- 18 paragraph "f" or "g".
- 19 Sec. 3. Section 321.189, subsection 1, Code 1997, is
- 20 amended by adding the following new paragraphs:
- 21 NEW PARAGRAPH. f. Class Cl -- Valid for the operation of
- 22 a motor vehicle if the following conditions are met:
- 23 (1) The person issued the license is sixteen years of age.
- 24 (2) The person issued the license has held an instruction
- 25 permit issued under section 321.180 for at least six months.
- 26 (3) The person has completed at least fifty hours of
- 27 supervised driving including at least ten hours of supervised
- 28 driving during hours of darkness.
- 29 (4) The person has operated a motor vehicle under the
- 30 permit for at least the three most recent months prior to
- 31 issuance of the license without an accident or violation,
- 32 other than a parking violation under section 321.210.
- 33 (5) The person has completed an approved driver education
- 34 course.
- 35 A class Cl license shall authorize the holder to operate

- 1 the same motor vehicles as a class C license holder, except
- 2 that a person issued a class Cl license shall not operate a
- 3 motor vehicle between the hours of midnight and five a.m.
- 4 unless the person is accompanied by a parent or guardian or is
- 5 going to or from the person's place of employment.
- 6 NEW PARAGRAPH. g. Class Ml -- Valid for the operation of

- 29 through "e" shall only be issued to a person seventeen years
- 30 of age who has held a license under paragraph "f" or "g" for

- 32 violations, other than parking violations under section

- 34 of a license under paragraphs "a" through "e".
- 35 Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE AND APPLICABILITY DATES. This Act takes

1 effect on July 1, 1997, for the purpose of adoption of rules 2 by the department of transportation. The Act is applicable to 3 licenses issued to minors on and after July 1, 1998. EXPLANATION This bill establishes a multistep process for obtaining a 6 driver's license for minors. Beginning July 1, 1998, a minor 7 who is issued a driver's license shall first have held an 8 instruction permit for at least six months, have logged at 9 least 50 hours of supervised driving, at least 10 hours of 10 which shall be during hours of darkness, shall not have any 11 traffic accidents or violations, other than parking 12 violations, during the three months preceding issuance of the 13 license, and shall have completed an approved driver education The bill creates new licenses specifically for 16-15 year-olds. These licenses, class C1 for motor vehicles other 16 than motorcycles and class M1 for motorcycles, restrict 17 operation of a motor vehicle to between the hours of 5 a.m. 18 and midnight unless the license holder is accompanied by a 19 parent or quardian or traveling to or from the person's job. In order to obtain a regular driver's license, a person has 21 to be 17 years of age, have held a class C1 or M1 license for 22 at least six months, and have no accidents or traffic 23 violations other than parking violations for the three months 24 immediately preceding issuance of a regular license. 25 The bill takes effect July 1, 1997, for the purpose of 26 adoption of rules by the department of transportation. 27 bill is applicable to licenses issued to minors on and after 28 July 1, 1998. 29 30 31 32 33 34
