A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to the reimbursement of defense costs for a peace officer of the department of public safety. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 

- 1 Section 1. Section 80.37, Code 1997, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 80.37 REIMBURSEMENT OF DEFENSE COSTS.
- 4 If a peace officer employed in any division of the
- 5 department is required to appear before a grand jury to answer
- 6 for a public offense or is charged with the alleged commission
- 7 of public offense, based on acts or omissions within the scope
- 8 of the officer's lawful duty or authority, and no indictment
- 9 is found and filed by the grand jury against the officer, or
- 10 the charge is dismissed or the officer is acquitted of the
- 11 charge, the presiding magistrate or judge shall enter judgment
- 12 awarding reimbursement to the officer for any costs incurred
- 13 in appearing before the grand jury or defending against the
- 14 charge, including but not limited to a reasonable attorney
- 15 fee,-if-the-court-finds-the-existence-of-any-of-the-following
- 16 grounds:
- 17 1:--The-charge-was-without-probable-cause-
- 18 2---The-charge-was-filed-for-malicious-purposes-
- 19 3.--The-charge-was-unwarranted-in-consideration-of-all-of
- 20 the-circumstances-and-matters-of-law-attending-the-alleged
- 21 offense.
- 22 The officer may apply for review of a failure or refusal to
- 23 rule or an adverse ruling as-to-the-existence-of-any-of-the
- 24 above-grounds concerning the reimbursement of defense costs to
- 25 a peace officer as provided in this section. The application
- 26 shall be to a district judge if the officer is seeking review
- 27 of the act of a magistrate or district associate judge and it
- 28 shall be to a different district judge if review is sought of
- 29 an act of a district judge.
- 30 EXPLANATION
- 31 This bill provides that a peace officer employed by the
- 32 department of public safety is entitled to a reimbursement of
- 33 defense costs if the officer is required to appear before a
- 34 grand jury to answer for a public offense and no indictment is
- 35 returned by the grand jury. In addition, the bill eliminates

1 the requirement that a peace officer seeking reimbursement of 2 defense costs establish that, in addition to having the charge 3 filed against the officer either dismissed or the officer 4 acquitted, the charge was filed without probable cause, filed 5 for a malicious purpose, or was unwarranted.
