A BILL FOR

1 An Act allowing teaching parents to provide driver's education

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 TLSB 2254HH 77 mk/cf/24

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1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321.178A DRIVER EDUCATION --2 TEACHING PARENT.

3 1. TEACHING PARENT QUALIFICATIONS. As an alternative to 4 section 321.178, a teaching parent may instruct a student in 5 driver's education courses. To qualify as a teaching parent, 6 the parent or guardian must hold a teaching certificate at the 7 secondary level and a valid certificate to teach driver's 8 education or comply with the definition of a teaching parent 9 in this section and provide certified evidence that the 10 requirements under this section have been met.

11 2. DEFINITIONS. For purposes of this section: 12 a. "Student" means a person within the custody and control 13 of the teaching parent, who is between the ages of fourteen 14 and twenty-one years of age and who satisfies preliminary 15 licensing requirements of the department.

b. "Teaching parent" means a person who is the parent or 17 guardian of a student who holds a current valid Iowa license 18 to operate a motor vehicle and who elects to engage in 19 instruction of the student.

20 3. COURSE OF INSTRUCTION. A driver education course
21 administered by a teaching parent shall consist at a minimum
22 of the following:

23 a. Thirty clock hours of classroom instruction.

24 b. Fifty hours of street or highway driving.

25 c. Four hours of classroom instruction concerning26 substance abuse.

The content of the course of instruction required under this subsection shall be equivalent to that required under section 321.178. However, the course requirements, reference and study materials, manuals, study aids, workbooks, physical requirements, classroom dimensions, type of chalkboards, extra vehicle safety equipment, extra foot brake, cut-off switches, and extra mirrors required for instruction under section 34 321.178 shall not be required for the course of instruction 35 provided under this section.

4. COURSE COMPLETION AND CERTIFICATION. Upon completion
 2 of a course under this section, the teaching parent shall
 3 document or provide evidence showing substantial statutory
 4 compliance with the requirements of subsection 3 and certify
 5 by affidavit to the department of education that the course
 6 has been completed. Documentation shall include the
 7 following:

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8 a. An affidavit attesting to satisfactory completion of9 course work and laboratory experience.

b. A listing of subjects presented in classroom training.
c. Copies of written tests completed by the student.
d. A statement of the number of classroom hours of
instruction.

14 e. A log of street and highway instruction including the 15 date when the lessons were conducted, the student's and the 16 parent's name and initials noted next to each entry, notes on 17 driving activities, including a list of driving deficiencies 18 and improvements, and the duration of the driving time for 19 each session. If the department of education is satisfied 20 that the course has been completed in accordance with this 21 section, the department shall certify it as an approved 22 driver's education course.

5. DRIVER'S LICENSE. Any student who successfully completes an approved driver education course as provided in this section shall be eligible for a driver's license at the age of sixteen years.

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EXPLANATION

This bill allows a parent or guardian to teach driver's education and allows a student who successfully completes the teaching parent instruction to obtain a driver's license. To qualify as a teaching parent, the person must hold a teaching certificate at the secondary level and a valid certificate to teach driver's education or comply with the definition of a teaching parent and provide certified evidence that all the requirements in the bill have been met.

1 The bill defines "student" as a person within the custody 2 and control of the teaching parent, who is between the ages of 3 14 and 21 years of age and who satisfies the state department 4 of transportation's preliminary licensing requirements, and 5 "teaching parent" as a person who is the parent or guardian of 6 a student who holds a current valid Iowa license to operate a 7 motor vehicle and who elects to engage in instruction of the 8 student.

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The bill provides that a driver education course 9 10 administered by a teaching parent shall consist of 30 clock 11 hours of classroom instruction, 50 hours of street or highway 12 driving, and four hours of classroom instruction concerning 13 substance abuse. Currently, a student must take 30 hours of 14 classroom instruction, six or more hours of laboratory 15 instruction, of which at least three hours must be street or 16 highway driving, four hours of substance abuse instruction, 20 17 minutes of instruction concerning railroad crossing safety, 18 and instruction relating to becoming an organ donor. The 19 content of the instruction shall be equivalent to that 20 required under section 321.178. The course requirements, 21 reference and study materials, manuals, study aids, workbooks, 22 physical requirements, classroom dimensions, type of 23 chalkboards, extra vehicle safety equipment, extra foot brake, 24 cut-off switches, and extra mirrors are not required for a 25 course of instruction under this section.

When the course is completed, the teaching parent must document or provide evidence showing substantial statutory compliance and certify that information by affidavit to the department. Documentation includes an affidavit attesting to satisfactory completion of course work and laboratory experience, a listing of subjects presented in classroom training, copies of written tests completed by the student, a statement of the number of classroom hours, and a log of street and highway instruction including the date when the lessons were conducted, the student's name and initials, the

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1 parent's name and initials, notes on driving activities, 2 including deficiencies and improvements, and the driving time 3 for each session. If the department of education is satisfied 4 that the course has been completed as required in accordance 5 with section 321.178A, the department of education shall 6 certify the course as an approved driver's education course. 7 A student who successfully completes an approved driver's 8 education course is eligible for a driver's license at 16 9 years of age.



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
