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1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 124.509A STUDY OF MARIJUANA FOR 2 MEDICINAL PURPOSES.

S.F. _____ H.F. 422

3 1. INTENT. The general assembly finds that it is 4 important to conduct research into the use of marijuana for 5 medicinal purposes to determine if or to substantiate that 6 marijuana can be safely used under medical supervision and 7 that the cannabis plant, in its natural form, has therapeutic 8 benefits that are often of critical medical importance to 9 persons afflicted with a variety of life-threatening and 10 sense-threatening illnesses.

11 2. The state university of Iowa hospitals and clinics, in 12 conjunction with the board of pharmacy examiners, may perform 13 or supervise the performance of research concerning the use of 14 marijuana for medicinal purposes. The research may address 15 but is not limited to any of the following areas:

a. Development of laboratory methods for the analysis of
marijuana confiscated from criminal activities. The analysis
shall be for the purposes of determining whether the marijuana
would meet United States food and drug administration
standards to be used for medical research purposes.

b. Identification of a tamper-free means of cultivating
22 effective and safe marijuana plants to be used for medicinal
23 purposes.

c. Identification of entities appropriate for the
manufacturing and processing of marijuana for medicinal
purposes.

d. Examination of the possible benefits for patients toutilize marijuana for medicinal purposes.

3. Research conducted under this section shall be performed under the supervision of the state university of lowa hospitals and clinics, in conjunction with the board of pharmacy examiners. The research shall be subject to approval of the United States food and drug administration, national institute of drug abuse, and other appropriate state and federal regulatory authorities.



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4. Notwithstanding contrary provisions of this chapter, it
 2 is lawful for a person who is approved by the state university
 3 of Iowa hospitals and clinics, in conjunction with the board
 4 of pharmacy examiners, to conduct research in accordance with
 5 this section or to knowingly or intentionally possess
 6 marijuana for use in connection with the research.

7 5. The state university of Iowa hospitals and clinics and
8 the board of pharmacy examiners may convene an advisory panel
9 consisting of medical experts, law enforcement personnel,
10 attorneys, educators, and other interested persons to provide
11 guidance to the research conducted under this section.

12 6. A report concerning research conducted under this
13 section shall be submitted to the governor and the general
14 assembly annually in December.

EXPLANATION

16 This bill provides for research concerning the use of 17 marijuana for medicinal purposes and makes an appropriation. 18 The bill includes a statement as to legislative findings. 19 The study may be performed by or supervised by the state 20 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics in conjunction with 21 the board of pharmacy examiners. The research may address 22 various areas specified by the bill. The research is subject 23 to approval by designated federal agencies and by other 24 federal and state regulatory agencies.

The bill provides that knowing or intentional possession of marijuana in connection with approved research is lawful. An advisory panel consisting of various regulatory and professional entities may be used to provide guidance to the presearch. A report concerning any research conducted is to be submitted to the governor and the general assembly annually in locember.

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
