A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of a domestic abuse death review team including providing for membership, duties, immunity for members acting in their official capacity, and providing confidentiality provisions. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: TLSB 1494HH 77 pf/jj/8

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 236B.1 PURPOSE.

2 The purpose of the domestic abuse death review team is to 3 aid in the reduction of the incidences of serious injury or 4 death to individuals in domestic relationships by accurately 5 identifying the cause and manner of death.

6 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 236B.2 DEFINITIONS.

7 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 8 requires:

9 1. "Department" means the Iowa department of public 10 health.

2. "Director" means the director of public health.
 3. "Domestic abuse" means domestic abuse as defined in
 13 section 236.2.

14 4. "Domestic abuse death" means a homicide or suicide 15 which involves or is the result of an assault as defined in 16 section 708.1 and to which any of the following circumstances 17 apply to the parties involved:

a. The alleged or convicted perpetrator is related to the
decedent as spouse, separated spouse, or former spouse.
b. The alleged or convicted perpetrator resided with the
decedent at the time of the assault which resulted in the
homicide or suicide.

c. The alleged or convicted perpetrator and the decedent
resided together within the past year but did not reside
together at the time of the assault which resulted in the
homicide or suicide.

d. The alleged or convicted perpetrator and decedent are
28 parents of the same minor child, whether they were married or
29 lived together at any time.

30 e. The alleged or convicted perpetrator was in an ongoing31 relationship with the decedent.

32 f. The alleged or convicted perpetrator has been arrested 33 for or convicted of stalking the decedent.

34 g. The decedent was related by blood or affinity or lived 35 in the same household with or was in the workplace or

proximity of an individual who was threatened with domestic
 abuse by the alleged or convicted perpetrator.

3 5. "Team" means the domestic abuse death review team.
4 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 236B.3 DOMESTIC ABUSE DEATH REVIEW
5 TEAM ESTABISHED -- MEMBERS.

6 1. A domestic abuse death review team is established as an
7 independent unit in the department. The department shall
8 provide staffing and administrative support to the team and
9 shall establish a database of all known domestic abuse deaths.
10 2. The membership of the team is subject to the provisions
11 of sections 69.16 and 69.16A relating to political affiliation
12 and gender balance. The team shall include members residing
13 or working in both rural and urban areas of Iowa.

Team members who are not designated by another
 appointing authority shall be appointed by the director.

16 4. Membership terms shall be three-year staggered terms.
17 A membership vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the
18 original appointment.

19 5. The team shall elect a chairperson, a vice chairperson,20 and other officers as deemed necessary by the team.

21 6. The team shall meet upon the call of the chairperson,
22 upon the request of a state agency, or as determined by a
23 majority of members of the team.

7. The members of the team are eligible for reimbursement
25 of actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance
26 of their official duties.

8. The team shall include all of the following members:
a. The state medical examiner or the state medical
examiner's designee.

b. A licensed physician who is knowledgeable concerning
31 domestic abuse deaths, suicide, and child deaths by homicide.
32 c. A licensed mental health professional who is
33 knowledgeable concerning domestic abuse.

34 d. A representative or designee of the Iowa coalition35 against domestic violence.

e. One member of the Iowa child death review team who is
 knowledgeable concerning domestic abuse.

3 f. A certified or licensed professional who is4 knowledgeable concerning substance abuse.

5 g. A law enforcement investigator experienced in domestic 6 abuse investigation.

7 h. A county attorney.

8 i. A judicial officer appointed by the chief justice of9 the supreme court.

10 j. A clerk of the district court appointed by the chief 11 justice of the supreme court.

k. A judicial district department of correctional
services' employee assigned batterers' treatment program
responsibilities.

1. An attorney licensed in this state who provides
 16 criminal defense assistance or child custody representation,
 17 and who is experienced in dissolution of marriage proceedings.
 18 m. A former victim of domestic abuse or a family member of
 19 a decedent whose death resulted from domestic abuse.

20 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 236B.4 LIAISONS.

21 The following individuals shall designate a liaison to 22 assist the team in fulfilling the team's duties:

23 1. The attorney general.

24 2. The director of the Iowa department of corrections.

25 3. The director of public health.

26 4. The director of human services.

27 5. The commissioner of public safety.

28 6. The administrator of the division for records and29 statistics of the Iowa department of public health.

30 7. The director of the department of education.

31 8. The state court administrator.

32 9. The director of the department of human rights.

33 10. The director of the Iowa law enforcement academy or 34 the director's designee.

35 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 236B.5 DUTIES OF THE TEAM.

1 The team shall perform all of the following duties: 2 1. Collect, review, and analyze death certificates and 3 death data, including investigative reports, medical and 4 counseling records, victim service records, employment 5 records, child abuse reports, or other confidential 6 information concerning domestic abuse deaths, survivor 7 interviews and surveys, and other information deemed by the 8 team as necessary and appropriate concerning the causes and 9 manner of domestic abuse deaths.

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10 2. Prepare an annual report to the governor, supreme 11 court, attorney general, and the general assembly concerning 12 the contributing factors of domestic abuse deaths.

13 3. Recommend community interventions to prevent domestic 14 abuse deaths based on an analysis of the contributing factors 15 to such deaths.

16 4. Recommend to agencies represented on the team changes 17 which may prevent domestic abuse deaths.

18 5. Maintain the confidentiality of any record or other 19 confidential information reviewed.

20 6. Establish committees or panels to which the team may21 assign some of the team's responsibilities.

22 Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 236B.6 DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT AND 23 OTHER ENTITIES.

The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
 17A relating to the administration of the domestic abuse death
 review team.

27 2. To the extent possible, the department shall coordinate 28 the activities of the domestic abuse death review team and the 29 Iowa child death review team to achieve administrative 30 efficiency.

31 3. The department may inspect and reproduce information 32 and records which are confidential under section 22.7 or 33 chapter 236A for the purposes of administration of and 34 performance of official duties by the team.

35 4. Upon request of the department, the departments of

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1 human services, public safety, workforce development, and 2 justice, county attorneys, county sheriffs, municipal police 3 departments, victim service providers, medical and counseling 4 providers, and other public authorities or private or 5 nonprofit agencies shall provide reasonable assistance to 6 administer the team. Ē

7 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 236B.7 IMMUNITY.

8 1. A person in possession or control of investigative or 9 other information pertaining to a domestic abuse death shall 10 allow the inspection and reproduction of the information by 11 the department upon the request of the department, to be used 12 only in the administration of and duties performed by the 13 domestic abuse death review team. Information which is 14 confidential under section 22.7 or chapter 236A and 15 information received from such confidential information shall 16 be maintained as confidential information under this section. 17 A person is immune from liability for releasing information to 18 the department as required under this chapter.

19 2. A team member and their agent or employee are not 20 subject to and are immune from claims, suits, liability, 21 damages, or any civil or criminal recourse arising from any 22 act, proceeding, decision, or determination undertaken or 23 performed, or recommendation made, provided the individual has 24 acted in good faith and without malice in carrying out the 25 individual's official responsibilities, authority, duties, 26 powers, and privileges. Complainants shall bear the burden of 27 proving malice or lack of good faith on the part of the 28 individual to overcome the immunity provided to the individual 29 under this section.

30 Sec. 8. INITIAL TERMS. As nearly as possible, one-third 31 of the initial members shall serve for three years, one-third 32 of the initial members shall serve for two years, and one-33 third of the initial members shall serve for one year, as 34 designated by the director.

EXPLANATION

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This bill establishes a domestic abuse death review team as 1 2 a unit within the Iowa department of public health which is to 3 provide administrative support to the team. The bill provides 4 for the purpose of the team, the membership of the team, the 5 appointment of liaisons from state agencies to assist the 6 team, and the duties of the team. The duties of the team 7 include the review and analysis of a variety of information 8 relating to domestic abuse deaths, the preparation of an 9 annual report to be submitted to the governor, the supreme 10 court, the attorney general, and the general assembly 11 concerning the factors contributing to domestic abuse deaths, 12 the provision of recommendations regarding community 13 interventions to prevent domestic abuse deaths, the provision 14 of recommendations regarding changes that agencies and others 15 might make in preventing domestic abuse deaths, and the 16 maintaining of the confidentiality of information reviewed. 17 The Iowa department of public health is directed to adopt 18 rules relating to the administration of the team. The bill 19 establishes immunity for team members from certain acts or 20 omissions made in the good faith performance of their official 21 duties. The department is also instructed to request 22 assistance from other agencies and entities in administering 23 the team. The bill provides that any information regarding a 24 domestic abuse death which is confidential is to be used 25 solely for the purposes of administration and the performance 26 of duties of the team, provides that confidential information 27 is to remain confidential under existing law, and provides 28 that liability is not incurred by a person for release of 29 confidential information to the department under the bill. 30 The bill provides that the department may use confidential 31 information for the purposes of administration and performance 32 of duties of the team.
