HOUSE FILE 542 FISCAL NOTE

The estimate for House File 542 is hereby submitted as a fiscal note pursuant to Joint Rule 17 and as a correctional impact statement pursuant to Section 2.56, Code of Iowa. Data used in developing this fiscal note and correctional impact statement are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 542 establishes a new Class D felony for intentionally throwing or expelling blood, seminal fluid, urine, or feces on a jail or prison employee by an inmate.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. There are an estimated 40 prison incidents and 24 jail incidents per year that will lead to convictions under the new law.
- 2. The average length of stay for these inmates will increase by 14 months.
- 3. Charge, conviction, sentencing patterns, length of stay, revocation rates, and other corrections policies will remain the same.
- 4. There will be a six month lag for the prosecution of the first offenders.
- 5. The marginal cost for adding one inmate to the prison system is \$12 per day.

CORRECTIONAL IMPACT

There will be nine additional inmates in FY 1998, 19 additional inmates in FY 1999, and 65 additional inmates in FY 2002 because of this change.

(The impact may be lower than the estimate if the Department of Corrections and local officials decide not to prosecute all offenders.)

FISCAL IMPACT

This change will increase costs for the Department of Corrections by \$39,000 in FY 1998, \$149,000 in FY 1999, and \$285,000 in FY 2002.
