1 Section 1. Section 461A.15, Code 1997, is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 461A.15 USE OF PRIVATE FUNDS.

<u>1.</u> The commission may permit the improvement of parks,
5 when established, or the improvement of bodies of water, upon
6 the border of which such parks may be established, by the
7 expenditure of private funds, such improvement to be done,
8 however, under the direction of the commission, by and with
9 the consent of the executive council.

2. a. Subject to compliance with development and
 maintenance plans, the commission shall enter into an
 agreement with one or more private organizations to finance,
 develop, and maintain one or more multipurpose trails in
 public areas owned by the United States corps of engineers and
 managed by the department. The agreement shall provide for
 the development and long-term maintenance of a multipurpose
 trail by the private organization. A multipurpose trail shall
 be developed for multiple uses including, but not limited to,
 foot traffic, snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, horseback
 riding, and incidental uses.

21 b. As used in the subsection:

22 (1) "Incidental use" means the use of any public area for 23 riding horses for the following purposes:

24 (a) Traveling from a designated watering station to a

27 (c) Allowing others to pass.

32 (2) "Public area" means any park, recreation area, forest,

33 preserve, game management area, wildlife area, or public

EXPLANATION

1 This bill codifies the terms "public area" and "incidental 2 use" as they relate to riding horses on public lands and 3 trails under the jurisdiction of the department of natural 4 resources.

5 The bill also provides that, subject to compliance with 6 development and maintenance plans, the natural resource 7 commission shall enter into an agreement with private 8 organizations to finance, develop, and maintain multipurpose 9 trails. The trails are to be designed and developed for 10 multiple uses including, but not limited to, foot traffic, 11 snowmobiling, cross-country skiing, and horseback riding.
