1 Section 1. Fifty percent of the funds appropriated from 2 the general fund of the state to the Iowa department of public 3 health for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, and ending 4 June 30, 1998, for the training of emergency medical services 5 (EMS) personnel at the state, county, and local levels, 6 notwithstanding any contrary requirements of the 7 appropriation, shall be deposited into the emergency medical 8 services fund pursuant to section 135.25 and shall be used, on 9 a dollar-for-dollar matching basis, to assist counties in 10 purchasing emergency medical services equipment. In addition, 11 the department shall investigate new and innovative 12 alternative methods of emergency medical services equipment 13 acquisition.

EXPLANATION

This bill provides that the emergency medical services fund established in Code section 135.25 shall receive additional funding for the 1997-1998 fiscal year for the purpose of mergency medical services equipment acquisition by counties. The matching fund requirements of Code section 135.25 would apply to the funding. The bill provides that fifty percent of the funds appropriated to the Iowa department of public health for emergency medical services training shall be deposited into the fund for equipment acquisition. Additionally, the department is instructed to investigate new and innovative alternative methods of emergency medical services equipment acquisition by counties.
