A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to handicapped parking permits by providing for nonexpiring removable windshield placards for persons with a 2 lifelong disability, eliminating the requirement that 3 physicians or chiropractors sign removable windshield 4 placards, and eliminating certain identification requirements 5 for handicapped persons and providing an effective date. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 8 9 10 11 12 13 14

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- Section 1. Section 321L.1, Code 1997, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 8. "Lifelong disability" means a
- 4 disability described under subsection 7 which has been
- 5 determined to be permanent by a person authorized to provide
- 6 the statement of disability required by section 321L.2.
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph a,
- 8 subparagraph (3), Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (3) Removable windshield placard. A handicapped person
- 10 may apply for a temporary removable windshield placard which
- 11 shall be valid for a period of up to six months, -as-determined
- 12 by-the-physician's-or-chiropractor's-statement-under-this
- 13 subsection or a nonexpiring removable windshield placard which
- 14 shall-be-valid-for-a-period-of-four-years-from-the-date-of
- 15 issuance, as determined by the physician's or chiropractor's
- 16 statement under this subsection. A temporary removable
- 17 windshield placard shall be renewed within thirty days of the
- 18 date of expiration. To-renew-the-placard, the-person-shall
- 19 comply-with-the-requirements-for-initial-issuance-of-the
- 20 placard-under-this-section. Persons seeking temporary
- 21 removable windshield placards shall be required to furnish
- 22 evidence upon initial application that they are temporarily.
- 23 handicapped and, in addition, furnish evidence at subsequent
- 24 intervals that they remain temporarily handicapped. Temporary
- 25 removable windshield placards shall be of a distinctively
- 26 different color from nonexpiring removable windshield
- 27 placards. A nonexpiring removable windshield placard shall
- 28 state on the face of the placard that it is a nonexpiring
- 29 placard. The department shall issue one additional removable
- 30 windshield placard upon the request of a handicapped person.
- 31 Sec. 3. Section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code
- 32 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 33 b. The department may issue expiring removable windshield
- 34 placards to the following:
- 35 (1) An organization which has a program for transporting

- 1 the handicapped or elderly.
- 2 (2) A person in the business of transporting the
- 3 handicapped or elderly.
- 4 One expiring removable windshield placard may be issued for
- 5 each vehicle used by the organization or person for
- 6 transporting the handicapped or elderly. A placard issued
- 7 under this paragraph shall be renewed every four years from
- 8 the date of issuance and shall be surrendered to the
- 9 department if the organization or person is no longer
- 10 providing the service for which the placard was issued.
- 11 Notwithstanding section 321L.4, a person transporting
- 12 handicapped or elderly in a motor vehicle for which a placard
- 13 has been issued under this paragraph may display the placard
- 14 in the motor vehicle and may use a handicapped parking space
- 15 while the motor vehicle is displaying the placard. A placard
- 16 issued under this paragraph shall be of a distinctively
- 17 different color from a placard issued under paragraph "a". An

- 20 exempt-from-the-handicapped-designation-requirement-under

- Sec. 5. Section 321L.2, subsection 5, Code 1997, is

- 35 displaying a handicapped parking permit; by an operator of a

- 1 motor vehicle displaying a handicapped parking permit but not
- 2 being used by a-person-in-possession-of-a-motor-vehicle
- 3 license-with-a-handicapped-designation-or-a-nonoperator's
- 4 identification-card-with-a-handicapped-designation,-other-than
- 5 a person issued a permit or being transported in accordance
- 6 with section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph "b"; or by a
- 7 motor vehicle in violation of the rules adopted by the
- 8 department under section 321L.8, constitutes improper use of a
- 9 handicapped parking permit, which is a misdemeanor for which a
- 10 fine shall be imposed upon the owner, operator, or lessee of
- 11 the motor vehicle or the person to whom the handicapped
- 12 parking permit is issued. The fine for each violation shall
- 13 be one hundred dollars. Proof of conviction of two or more
- 14 violations involving improper use of a handicapped parking
- 15 permit is grounds for revocation by the court or the
- 16 department of the holder's privilege to possess or use the
- 17 handicapped parking permit.
- 18 Sec. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
- 19 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 20 EXPLANATION
- 21 This bill authorizes the state department of transportation
- 22 to issue nonexpiring removable windshield placards to persons
- 23 who are handicapped by reason of a lifelong disability. To be
- 24 eligible for a nonexpiring placard, a physician or
- 25 chiropractor must state in writing to the department that the
- 26 person's disability is permanent. A nonexpiring placard must
- 27 be a different color from a temporary placard and state that
- 28 it is a nonexpiring placard.
- 29 Currently, certain persons who transport handicapped or
- 30 elderly persons may obtain removable windshield placards which
- 31 must be renewed every four years. The bill designates these
- 32 placards as expiring removable windshield placards. Persons
- 33 receiving these placards must comply with Code section 321L.4
- 34 regarding the display and use of the permit.
- 35 The bill eliminates the requirement that the physician or

1 chiropractor who made the determination regarding the 2 handicapped person's disability sign the removable windshield 3 placard. The bill also eliminates the requirement that a 4 handicapped person who obtains a removable windshield placard 5 have a handicapped designation on the person's driver's 6 license or obtain a nonoperator's identification card.

seeking temporary removable windshield placards shall be required to furnish evidence upon initial application that they are-temporarily-handicapped have a temporary disability and, in addition, furnish evidence at subsequent intervals that they remain temporarily handicapped disabled. Temporary removable windshield placards shall be of a distinctively different color from nonexpiring removable windshield placards. A nonexpiring removable windshield placard shall state on the face of the placard that it is a nonexpiring placard. The department shall issue one additional removable windshield placard upon the request of a handicapped person with a disability.

- Sec. 11. Section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- b. The department may issue <u>expiring</u> removable windshield placards to the following:
- (1) An organization which has a program for transporting the-handicapped-or-elderly persons with disabilities or elderly persons.
- (2) A person in the business of transporting the handicapped-or-elderly persons with disabilities or elderly persons.

One expiring removable windshield placard may be issued for each vehicle used by the organization or person for transporting the-handicapped-or-elderly persons with disabilities or elderly persons. A placard issued under this paragraph shall be renewed every four years from the date of issuance and shall be surrendered to the department if the organization or person is no longer providing the service for which the placard was issued. Notwithstanding section 321L.4, a person transporting handicapped-or-elderly persons with disabilities or elderly persons in a motor vehicle for which a placard has been issued under this paragraph may display the placard in the motor vehicle and may use a handicapped persons with disabilities parking space while the motor vehicle is

displaying the placard. A placard issued under this paragraph shall be of a distinctively different color from a placard issued under paragraph "a". An-organization-issued-a removable-windshield-placard-and-a-handicapped-person-being transported-under-this-subsection-are-exempt-from-the handicapped-designation-requirement-under-section-3215-4-

- Sec. 12. Section 321L.2, subsection 3, paragraph b, subparagraph (3), Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- (3) The signature of the person who has been issued the placard and-the-signature-of-the-physician-or-chiropractor-who made-the-determination-that-the-person-was-handicapped-for purposes-of-issuance-of-the-placard.
- Sec. 13. Section 321L.2, subsection 5, Code 1997, is amended by striking the subsection.
- Sec. 14. Section 321L.4, subsection 2, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 2. The use of a handicapped persons with disabilities parking space, located on either public or private property as provided in sections 321L.5 and 321L.6, by an operator of a motor vehicle not displaying a handicapped persons with disabilities parking permit; by an operator of a motor vehicle displaying a handicapped persons with disabilities parking permit but not being used by a-person-in-possession-of-a-motor vehicle-license-with-a-handicapped-designation-or-a nonoperator's-identification-card-with-a-handicapped designation, other than a person issued a permit or being transported in accordance with section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph "b"; or by a motor vehicle in violation of the rules adopted by the department under section 321L.8, constitutes improper use of a handicapped persons with disabilities parking permit, which is a misdemeanor for which a fine shall be imposed upon the owner, operator, or lessee of the motor vehicle or the person to whom the handicapped persons with disabilities parking permit is issued. The fine for each violation shall be one hundred dollars. Proof of conviction

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of two or more violations involving improper use of a handicapped persons with disabilities parking permit is grounds for revocation by the court or the department of the holder's privilege to possess or use the handicapped persons with disabilities parking permit.

Sec. 15. AMENDMENTS CHANGING TERMINOLOGY -- DIRECTIVES TO CODE EDITOR.

- 1. The Code editor shall substitute the words "persons with disabilities" for the word "handicapped" wherever the word "handicapped" is used in the terms "handicapped parking permit", "handicapped parking permits", "handicapped parking space", "handicapped parking spaces", "handicapped designation", "handicapped designations", "handicapped identification designations", "handicapped parking space", "handicapped parking spaces", "handicapped parking spaces", "handicapped parking signs", "handicapped parking sign", "handicapped parking signs", "handicapped parking signs", "handicapped parking sticker", "handicapped parking stickers", "handicapped registration plate", "handicapped registration plates", "handicapped identification device", and "handicapped identification devices".
- 2. The Code editor shall substitute the word "disability" for "handicap" where there appears to be no doubt as to the intent to refer to a disability.
- 3. The Code editor shall substitute the words "person with a disability" for the words "handicapped person" and the words "persons with disabilities" for the words "handicapped persons" where there appears to be no doubt as to the intent to refer to a person with a disability or persons with disabilities.
- Sec. 16. Section 321L.6, subsection 3, Code 1997, is amended by striking the subsection.
- Sec. 17. EFFECTIVE AND APPLICABILITY DATE PROVISIONS.

 This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. However, state agencies, political

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subdivisions of the state, and other persons which currently have signs or windshield placards, stickers, or other devices which bear the word "handicapped" or the statement required by section 321L.6, subsection 3, Code 1997, may continue to use the placards, stickers, or devices until they would be replaced in the normal course of business.
