A BILL FOR

1 An Act authorizing counties to levy taxes and issue bonds to
2 finance and operate zoos and zoological gardens.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 394.1, Code 1997, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 394.1 AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS -- TAXES.
- 4 Cities and counties are hereby authorized to contract
- 5 indebtedness and to issue general obligation bonds to provide
- 6 funds to pay the cost of opening, establishing, constructing,
- 7 improving, extending, or remodeling of a zoo or zoological
- 8 garden and to construct, reconstruct, or repair any such
- 9 improvement and to pay the cost of land needed for any of said
- 10 those purposes.
- 11 Taxes for the payment of said such bonds shall be levied in
- 12 accordance with chapter 767-and-said. The bonds shall be
- 13 payable through the debt service fund in not more than twenty
- 14 years, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding that
- 15 permitted by chapter 74A, and shall be of such form as the
- 16 city council or the county board of supervisors shall by
- 17 resolution provide, but no city or county shall become
- 18 indebted in excess of five percent of the actual value of the
- 19 taxable property within said the city or county, as shown by
- 20 the last preceding state and county tax lists. The
- 21 indebtedness incurred for the purpose provided in this section
- 22 shall not be considered an indebtedness incurred for general
- 23 or ordinary purposes.
- 24 This section shall be construed as granting additional
- 25 power without limiting the power already existing in cities
- 26 and counties.
- 27 The provisions of this section shall be applicable to all
- 28 counties and municipal corporations regardless of form of
- 29 government or manner of incorporation.
- 30 Sec. 2. Section 394.2, Code 1997, is amended to read as
- 31 follows:
- 32 394.2 QUESTION SUBMITTED TO VOTERS.
- 33 It shall not be necessary to submit to the voters the
- 34 proposition of issuing bonds for refunding purposes, but prior
- 35 to the issuance of bonds for other purposes the city council

- 1 or the county board of supervisors shall submit to the voters
- 2 of the city or the county at a general election or a regular
- 3 municipal election the proposition of issuing the bonds.
- 4 Notice of the election on the proposition of issuing bonds
- 5 shall be published as required by section 49.53. The notice
- 6 shall also state whether or not an admission fee is to be
- 7 charged by the zoo or zoological gardens.
- 8 Bonds issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter
- 9 shall be sold by the city council or the county board of
- 10 supervisors in the manner prescribed by chapter 75; however,
- 11 refunding bonds may either be sold and the proceeds applied to
- 12 the payment of the bonds to be refunded, or the refunding
- 13 bonds may be issued in exchange for the bonds being refunded
- 14 upon their surrender and cancellation.
- 15 Sec. 3. Section 394.3, Code 1997, is amended to read as
- 16 follows:
- 17 394.3 TAX FOR OPERATING ZOO.
- 18 A city or county establishing or having established a zoo
- 19 or zoological garden may authorize not to exceed a levy of
- 20 twenty-seven cents per thousand dollars of assessed valuation
- 21 on all taxable property within the corporation or the county
- 22 for the purpose of paying the costs of operating, maintaining,
- 23 and managing a zoo or zoological garden. The levy shall be
- 24 subject to cumulative levy limitations otherwise provided by
- 25 law unless said the levy shall have been submitted to and
- 26 approved by the voters of said the city or county.
- 27 Sec. 4. Section 394.4, Code 1997, is amended to read as
- 28 follows:
- 29 394.4 CONTRACTS WITH OTHER CITIES AND COUNTIES --
- 30 ELECTION.
- 31 Contracts may be made between any city or county
- 32 establishing or having established a zoo or zoological garden
- 33 and any other city or county-but-a-county-may-contract-only
- 34 with-respect-to-residents-outside-of-any-city,-for-the-use-of
- 35 such-zoo-or-zoological-garden-or-any-extension-service-thereof

- 1 by-its-residents,-and-for-the-levy-of-a-tax-in-support
- 2 thereof. Such contracts shall provide for the rate of tax to
- 3 be levied during the term thereof, not exceeding twenty-seven
- 4 cents per thousand dollars of assessed valuation. Said
- 5 contracts Such a contract may be submitted to the voters of
- 6 either a city or county which is a party to the contract and
- 7 shall not be subject to termination if approved by the voters
- 8 of both-parties more than one party.
- 9 If not so approved, such contracts may be modified by
- 10 mutual consent or may be terminated by the voters of either
- 11 any party thereto.
- 12 Any such tax shall be subject to cumulative levy
- 13 limitations applicable generally to the contracting parties
- 14 unless the contract shall have been approved by the voters.
- Any election held hereunder may be held upon notice and in
- 16 any manner provided by law applicable to the contracting party
- 17 with respect to elections upon special public propositions;
- 18 provided that it shall not be necessary to set out the
- 19 contract provisions in full as a part of the ballot.
- 20 EXPLANATION
- 21 This bill amends all of the sections in Code chapter 394.
- 22 Under the current law, only a city has the ability to finance
- 23 and contract for the establishment and operation of a zoo or
- 24 zoological garden.
- 25 The bill adds counties as another political body authorized
- 26 to contract or finance for the establishment and operation of
- 27 a zoo. The bill provides that a county may contract or issue
- 28 bonds for the opening, establishing, constructing, improving,
- 29 extending, or remodeling of a zoo.
- 30 The bill provides that, prior to the issuance of bonds, the
- 31 county board of supervisors shall submit the bond issue
- 32 proposition to voters. The sale of bonds by the county board
- 33 of supervisors shall be in the manner prescribed by Code
- 34 chapter 75.
- 35 The bill provides that a county establishing a zoo may

1 authorize property taxes to pay the costs of operating, 2 maintaining, and managing the zoo. The bill provides that a county establishing or having 4 established a zoo has the ability to contract with other 5 cities or counties for the use of the zoo.
