## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to abstinence education programs including the establishment of an abstinence education pilot program. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 

- 1 Section 1. ABSTINENCE EDUCATION PILOT PROGRAM -- CHOOSING 2 THE BEST.
- 3 1. The Iowa department of public health, in cooperation
- 4 with the department of human services and the department of
- 5 education, shall implement an abstinence education pilot
- 6 program entitled "Choosing the Best" to be implemented in both
- 7 rural and urban school districts in grades six through nine,
- 8 which may include development of a video for use in the
- 9 program. The Iowa department of public health shall implement
- 10 the program to comply with the requirements of section 912,
- 11 Subchapter V of the federal Social Security Act, as codified
- 12 in 42 U.S.C. § 701 et seq., which provides that abstinence
- 13 education means an educational or motivational program which
- 14 includes the following:
- 15 a. Has as its exclusive purpose teaching the social,
- 16 psychological, and health gains to be realized by abstaining
- 17 from sexual activity.
- 18 b. Teaches abstinence from sexual activity outside of
- 19 marriage as the expected standard for all school age children.
- 20 c. Teaches that abstinence from sexual activity is the
- 21 only certain way to avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy, sexually
- 22 transmitted diseases, and other associated health problems.
- d. Teaches that a mutually faithful monogamous
- 24 relationship in the context of marriage is the expected
- 25 standard of human sexual activity.
- 26 e. Teaches that sexual activity outside of the context of
- 27 marriage is likely to have harmful psychological and physical
- 28 effects.
- 29 f. Teaches that bearing children outside of marriage is
- 30 likely to have harmful consequences for the child, the child's
- 31 parents, and society.
- 32 g. Teaches young people how to reject sexual advances and
- 33 how alcohol and drug use increase vulnerability to sexual
- 34 advances.
- 35 h. Teaches the importance of attaining self-sufficiency

- 1 before engaging in sexual activity.
- 2 2. a. It is the intent of the general assembly that the
- 3 Iowa department of public health and the department of human
- 4 services shall identify existing abstinence education and
- 5 community-based programs which meet the guidelines specified
- 6 in subsection 1 in order for the required matching of federal
- 7 funding to be received on or after October 1, 1997.
- 8 b. Of the federal funds received by the Iowa department of
- 9 public health, not more than \$100,000 shall be used for
- 10 implementation of an abstinence education pilot program
- ll entitled "Choosing the Best" in accordance with the
- 12 requirements of subsection 1.
- 13 c. The remaining federal funds received by the Iowa
- 14 department of public health shall be used to provide grants
- 15 for abstinence education programs which are consistent with
- 16 the federal requirements of section 912, subchapter V, of the
- 17 federal Social Security Act, as codified in 42 U.S.C. § 701 et
- 18 seq. A grantee, including an existing program, may provide
- 19 three dollars in local, private, or other funding for every
- 20 four dollars of federal funding provided through the grant.
- 21 EXPLANATION
- 22 This bill directs the Iowa department of public health, in
- 23 cooperation with the department of human services and the
- 24 department of education, to implement an abstinence education
- 25 pilot program entitled "Choosing the Best" in both rural and
- 26 urban school districts in grades six through nine which may
- 27 include development of a video to be used in the program. The
- 28 bill defines abstinence education as provided in federal law
- 29 for the purposes of drawing down federal funding for the state
- 30 abstinence education pilot program and other state abstinence
- 31 education programs. The bill directs the Iowa department of
- 32 public health and the department of human services to identify
- 33 existing programs which meet the federal requirements to draw
- 34 down federal funds, provides that up to \$100,000 of the
- 35 federal funds received are to be used for the pilot program,

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1 and provides that the remaining federal funds received are to 2 be used to provide grants for abstinence education programs 3 which meet the federal requirements.

- 21 and for a fee which is the actual cost of postage and

- 24 following: "in accordance with the".
