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EXPLANATION

5 This bill provides that handicapped parking permits may be
6 issued pursuant to the statement of a physician assistant or
7 nurse practitioner. Currently, only physicians and
8 chiropractors may provide information to the department
9 regarding the disability of the person seeking the handicapped
10 permit.

11 The bill also makes physician assistants and nurse
12 practitioners subject to the \$300 civil penalty for providing
13 false information.

Sec. 2. Section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph a, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:

A handicapped resident of the state desiring a handicapped parking permit shall apply to the department upon an application form furnished by the department providing the applicant's name, address, date of birth, and social security number and shall also provide a statement from a physician licensed under chapter 148, 149, 150, or 150A, a physician assistant licensed under chapter 148C, an advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 152, or a chiropractor licensed under chapter 151, or a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or chiropractor licensed to practice in a contiguous state, written on the physician's, physician assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or chiropractor's stationery, stating the nature of the applicant's handicap and such additional information as required by rules adopted by the department under section 321L.8.
