- 9. MALPRACTICE.
- 4 a. Those Except as provided in paragraph "b", those
- 5 founded on injuries to the person or wrongful death against
- 6 any physician and surgeon, osteopath, osteopathic physician
- 7 and surgeon, dentist, podiatric physician, optometrist,
- 8 pharmacist, chiropractor, or nurse, licensed under chapter
- 9 147, or a hospital licensed under chapter 135B, arising out of
- 10 patient care, within two years after the date on which the
- ll claimant knew, or through the use of reasonable diligence
- 12 should have known, or received notice in writing of the
- 13 existence of, the injury or death for which damages are sought
