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SENATE FILE 2022 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for Senate File 2022 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2022 authorizes the Department of Transportation (DOT) Commission to temporarily transfer moneys from the Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy (RISE) Fund to the Primary Road Fund. The borrowed funds are required to be repaid to the RISE Fund within three months of any transfer. In addition, the DOT Commission is required to ensure that funds will be available to meet contract obligations for approved RISE projects.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Senate File 2022 is not expected to have a fiscal effect on the State or local jurisdictions receiving RISE funds.



As of December 31, 1997, the balance in the RISE Fund was \$57.2 million and the obligations totaled \$56.6 million. However, many of the agreements for several larger projects, which make up \$53.0 million in obligations, will not require total cash outlay for approximately 3 to 4 years. Senate File 2022 will allow the DOT Commission to use the available RISE funds for up to a three-month period to meet cash flow needs of the Primary Road Fund.
