1 Section 1. Section 455G.11, Code 1997, is amended by
2 adding the following new subsection:

3 NEW SUBSECTION. 12. A person engaged in the wholesale or
4 retail sale of petroleum shall receive a discount of eight
5 percent on that person's annual underground storage tank
6 insurance premium for all tanks located at a site which meets
7 all of the following conditions:

8 a. The person maintains a collection device for the
9 purpose of storing waste oil filters.

10 b. The person accepts waste oil filters from the general
11 public.

12 c. The person posts a notice at the site in a form and
13 manner approved by the administrator advertising that the
14 person will accept waste oil filters from the general public.

15 d. The person registers an end user, other than a sanitary
16 landfill, of the waste oil filters.

17 **EXPLANATION**

18 This bill provides that a person engaged in the wholesale
19 or retail sale of petroleum shall receive a discount of 8
20 percent on that person's annual underground storage tank
21 insurance premium for all tanks at a site if the person
22 maintains a collection device for storing waste oil filters,
23 accepts waste oil filters from the general public, posts a
24 notice at the site advertising that the person will accept
25 waste oil filters from the general public, and registers an
26 end user of the waste oil filters, other than a sanitary
27 landfill.

FISCAL NOTE**

A fiscal note for Senate File 2080 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2080 prohibits the disposal of waste oil filters in a sanitary landfill. The Bill specifies that operators are eligible for a reduction in their Underground Storage Tank insurance premium when a collection and recycling program is implemented.

BACKGROUND

To encourage the recycling of waste oil filters, collection sites must post written notice identifying oil filter recycling sites. The recycling sites will provide the collection site with a receipt identifying all end users of recycled oil filters. The recycling sites will provide a list of all end users to the Department of Natural Resources. The recycling site must meet the following conditions to receive a discount on their insurance premium:

1. The recycling site maintains a collection device for the purpose of storing waste oil filters.
2. The recycling site accepts waste oil filters from the general public.
3. The recycling site advertises that waste oil filters are accepted from the general public and the advertisement is approved by the Department of Natural Resources.
4. The recycling center registers an end user other than a sanitary landfill of the waste oil filters.

ASSUMPTIONS

The average annual premium for an underground storage tank site is \$1,165. The number of insured sites is 2,150. An eight percent reduction in the annual premium equals \$93. If 25% of the sites participated, or 538 sites, this would decrease overall premiums by \$50,000.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated fiscal impact of Senate File 2080 would be an annual decrease of \$50,000 in the Underground Storage Tank insurance premium if 25% of the operators participated. There would be a \$100,000 decrease in premiums if 50% of the operators participated, \$150,000 if 75% participated, and \$200,000 if there was 100% participation.
