A BILL FOR 1 An Act regulating implements of husbandry. 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.453, Code 1997, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 321.453 EXCEPTIONS.
- The provisions of this chapter governing size, weight, and
- 5 load, and the permit requirements of chapter 321E do not apply
- 6 to fire apparatus, to road maintenance equipment owned by or
- 7 under lease to any state or local authority, to implements of
- 8 husbandry temporarily moved upon a highway, to implements of
- 9 husbandry moved from farm site to farm site or between the
- 10 retail seller and a farm purchaser within-a-one-hundred-mile
- 11 radius-from-the-retail-seller-s-place-of-business, to
- 12 implements of husbandry moved between any site and the site of
- 13 an agricultural exposition or a fair administered pursuant to
- 14 chapter 173 or 174, indivisible implements of husbandry
- 15 temporarily moved between the place of manufacture and a
- 16 retail seller or a farm purchaser, to implements of husbandry
- 17 received and moved by a retail seller of implements of
- 18 husbandry in exchange for an a purchased implement purchased,
- 19 or to implements of husbandry moved for repairs, except on any
- 20 part of the interstate highway system. A vehicle, carrying an
- 21 implement of husbandry, which is exempted from the permit
- 22 requirements under this section shall be equipped with an
- 23 amber flashing light under section 321.423, shall be equipped
- 24 with warning flags on that portion of the vehicle which
- 25 protrudes into oncoming traffic, and shall only operate from
- 26 thirty minutes prior to sunrise to thirty minutes following
- 27 sunset.

28 EXPLANATION

- 29 This bill amends Code section 321.453 which provides that
- 30 the provisions of Code chapter 321 regulating the size,
- 31 weight, and load of vehicles and Code chapter 321E requiring
- 32 permits for the movement of certain vehicles do not apply in
- 33 some cases to implements of husbandry. One exception provides
- 34 that an implement of husbandry may be moved between a retail
- 35 seller and a farm purchaser within a 100-mile radius from the

1 retail seller's place of business. This bill eliminates the
2 100-mile condition. It also provides that an implement of
3 husbandry may be moved between any site and the site of an
4 agricultural exposition or fair.

REGULATING IMPLEMENTS OF HUSBANDRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 321.453, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:

321.453 EXCEPTIONS.

The provisions of this chapter governing size, weight, and load, and the permit requirements of chapter 321E do not apply to fire apparatus, to road maintenance equipment owned by or under lease to any state or local authority, to implements of husbandry temporarily moved upon a highway, to implements of husbandry moved from farm site to farm site or between the retail seller and a farm purchaser within-a-one-hundred-mile radius-from-the-retail-seller's-place-of-business, to implements of husbandry moved between any site and the site of an agricultural exposition or a fair administered pursuant to chapter 173 or 174, indivisible implements of husbandry temporarily moved between the place of manufacture and a retail seller or a farm purchaser, to implements of husbandry received and moved by a retail seller of implements of husbandry in exchange for an a purchased implement purchased, or to implements of husbandry moved for repairs, except on any part of the interstate highway system. A vehicle, carrying an implement of husbandry, which is exempted from the permit requirements under this section shall be equipped with an amber flashing light under section 321.423, shall be equipped with warning flags on that portion of the vehicle which

protrudes into oncoming traffic, and shall only operate from thirty minutes prior to sunrise to thirty minutes following sunset.
