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Section 1. Section 96.7, subsection 12, paragraph d, Code 2 1997, is amended to read as follows: d. This subsection is repealed July 1, 1998 2001, and the 4 repeal is applicable to contribution rates for calendar year 5 1999 2002 and subsequent calendar years. Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect June 30, 7 1998. 8 EXPLANATION This bill amends the provision which would have repealed 10 the employment security administrative contribution surcharge 11 and its fund effective July 1, 1998, to provide for its repeal 12 on July 1, 2001. The administrative contribution surcharge is 13 imposed on employers, other than governmental entities and 14 nonprofit organizations, subject to the unemployment 15 compensation chapter and moneys collected are used by the 16 department of workforce development for costs associated with 17 certain rural and satellite departmental offices or for the 18 department-approved training fund. 19 The bill takes effect June 30, 1998, in order to take 20 effect before the scheduled repeal of Code section 96.7(12)(d) 21 on July 1, 1998. 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33

SENATE FILE 2112 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for Senate File 2112 is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2112 delays the sunset of the State Unemployment Administrative Surcharge for three years. Current <u>Code of Iowa</u> language sunsets the Surcharge at the end of calendar year 1998. Senate File 2112 would sunset the Surcharge at the end of calendar year 2001.

BACKGROUND AND ASSUMPTIONS

The Administrative Surcharge is paid by employers and is currently 0.05% of taxable wages subject to the Surcharge. The rate is applied to each employee's (excluding political subdivisions and non-profit employers) taxable wage. The taxable wage in FY 1999 is projected to be \$16,300, and the total of all taxable wages subject to the Administrative Surcharge is projected to be \$14.7 billion during that year. The taxable wage subject to the Surcharge is projected to increase \$600 in calendar year 2000, and an additional \$500 in calendar year 2001. The Surcharge is projected to remain at 0.05%.

Revenue raised by the Administrative Surcharge is deposited to a dedicated Department of Workforce Development fund. The money can only be used for personnel and non-personnel costs of rural and satellite departmental offices in population centers less than 20,000 persons or for the Department-Approved Training Fund created in Section 8, 1988 Iowa Acts.

FISCAL IMPACT

Senate File 2112 would raise \$23.3 million between January 1, 1999, and December 31, 2001. By fiscal year, the impact would be:

FY 1999 - \$3.0 million FY 2000 - \$7.5 million FY 2001 - \$7.9 million

FY 2002 - \$4.9 million

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
This act repeals the sunset on the state administrative contribution surcharge, which provides funds to administer the employment security programs in workforce development local offices. The surcharge was established in 1987 to replace reduced federal funding. Federal funding for the department has remained static since the late 1980's despite the increased demand for services and increased salary costs. Congress is not expected to appropriate adequate administrative funds even though the funds are available in the federal administrative accounts. The surcharge generated \$6.5 million in FY 1997.
