- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 730.6 ATTENDANCE AT POLITICAL 2 PARTY CONVENTIONS.
- 3 1. An employer shall permit an employee, upon reasonable
- 4 notice, to take unpaid time off from work to attend, as an
- 5 elected delegate, a regularly scheduled local, district,
- 6 county, state, or national convention of a political party as
- 7 defined in section 43.2.
- 8 2. An employer shall not take any adverse action against
- 9 an employee who exercises the employee's right to attend a
- 10 political party convention pursuant to this section.
- 3. A person who violates this section is, upon conviction,
- 12 quilty of a simple misdemeanor.
- 13 EXPLANATION
- 14 This bill provides that an employer shall permit an
- 15 employee to take unpaid time off from work to attend a
- 16 political party convention as an elected delegate. The bill
- 17 requires that the employee give the employer reasonable notice
- 18 of this request and provides that the employer shall not take
- 19 any adverse action against an employee exercising their rights
- 20 under this bill. A person who violates this new Code section
- 21 is guilty of a simple misdemeanor.
