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- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 261.24 REWARDING IOWA'S STUDENTS 2 EDUCATIONALLY PROGRAM.
- 3 1. Subject to an appropriation of sufficient funds by the
- 4 general assembly, a rewarding Iowa's students educationally
- 5 program is established to be administered by the commission.
- 6 A resident of this state who receives a high school diploma or
- 7 a high school equivalency diploma from a school district or an
- 8 accredited nonpublic school in this state after July 1, 1998,
- 9 and who otherwise meets the qualifications of this section, is
- 10 eligible to receive a rewarding Iowa's students educationally
- ll scholarship under the program to attend an eligible
- 12 institution.
- 13 2. In addition to the requirements of subsection 1, to be
- 14 eligible for a scholarship under this section, an individual
- 15 shall meet the following requirements:
- 16 a. Is a citizen of the United States or has been
- 17 classified as a permanent resident alien by the United States
- 18 immigration and naturalization service.
- 19 b. Have satisfactorily met the entrance requirements for
- 20 admission to an eligible institution.
- 21 c. Upon completing the equivalent of two full semesters or
- 22 three full quarters at an eligible institution, to continue to
- 23 be eligible for a scholarship under this section, the student
- 24 shall have a three-point cumulative grade average on a four-
- 25 point scale.
- 26 3. "Eligible institution", for purposes of this section,
- 27 means a community college as defined in chapter 260C, an
- 28 institution of higher learning under the control of the state
- 29 board of regents, or an accredited private institution, as
- 30 defined in section 261.9.
- 31 4. The amount of a scholarship awarded to a qualified
- 32 student for an upcoming academic year in accordance with this
- 33 section shall be the amount of the student's financial need
- 34 for that period, including tuition, mandatory fees, and a book
- 35 allowance. However, the scholarship amount shall not exceed

- 1 the resident tuition rate and mandatory fees established for
- 2 institutions of higher learning under the control of the state
- 3 board of regents plus a book allowance. The book allowance
- 4 for a full-time student shall be one hundred dollars per
- 5 quarter or the semester equivalent, and fifty dollars per
- 6 quarter or the semester equivalent for a student enrolled for
- 7 less than half-time.
- 8 5. No minimum number of hours of enrollment is required
- 9 for eligibility.
- 10 6. An eligible individual shall not receive a scholarship
- ll under this section for more than the equivalent of eight full
- 12 semesters.
- 13 7. An individual who qualifies for a federal Pell grant is
- 14 ineligible for a scholarship under this section. Federal
- 15 educational assistance received by an eligible individual
- 16 shall be applied to reduce the individual's tuition and
- 17 mandatory fee charges.
- 18 8. Scholarship moneys may be expended for remedial
- 19 coursework.
- 9. The college student aid commission shall adopt rules
- 21 pursuant to chapter 17A to administer this section. Rules
- 22 adopted by the commission shall, at a minimum, establish
- 23 criteria for deferment of a scholarship and provide for an
- 24 appeals process.

25 EXPLANATION

- 26 This bill, subject to an appropriation of sufficient funds
- 27 by the general assembly, establishes a rewarding Iowa's
- 28 students educationally scholarship program.
- 29 A resident of Iowa who receives a high school diploma or a
- 30 high school equivalency diploma from a school district or an
- 31 accredited nonpublic school in Iowa after July 1, 1998, is a
- 32 U.S. citizen or a permanent resident alien, and has
- 33 satisfactorily met the entrance requirements for admission to
- 34 an eligible institution, is eligible to receive a scholarship
- 35 to attend an eligible institution. However, to continue to

1 receive a scholarship, a student must also have a 3.0

2 cumulative grade average on a 4.0 scale. Scholarships can be

3 used to pay for remedial coursework.

4 The bill defines an "eligible institution", to be an Iowa

5 community college, an institution of higher learning under the

6 control of the state board of regents, or an accredited

7 private institution.

8 The amount of a scholarship awarded in accordance with this

9 section shall be the amount of the student's financial need

10 for an upcoming academic year, but cannot exceed the resident

11 tuition rate and mandatory fees established for regents'

12 institutions plus a book allowance. The book allowance for a

13 full-time student is \$100 per quarter or the semester

14 equivalent, and \$50 per quarter or the semester equivalent for

15 a student enrolled for less than half-time. No minimum number

16 of hours of enrollment is required for eligibility.

17 An individual can receive a scholarship for no more than

18 the equivalent of eight full semesters.

19 An individual who qualifies for a federal Pell grant is

20 ineligible for a scholarship. Federal educational assistance

21 received by an eligible individual shall be applied to reduce

22 the individual's tuition and mandatory fee charges.

Rules adopted by the college student aid commission shall,

24 at a minimum, establish criteria for deferment of a

25 scholarship and provide for an appeals process.

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
