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1 Section 1. Section 159.6, subsection 7, Code 1997, is
2 amended by striking the subsection.

3 Sec. 2. Section 159.6, subsection 9, Code 1997, is amended
4 to read as follows:

5 9. State aid received by certain associations as provided
6 in chapters 176 through ~~183~~ 182, 186, and 352.

7 Sec. 3. Section 159.20, subsection 5, Code 1997, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 5. Accumulate and diffuse information concerning the
10 marketing of agricultural commodities in cooperation with
11 persons, agencies, or the federal government. ~~The department~~
12 ~~shall establish an agricultural commodity informational data~~
13 ~~base.~~

14 Sec. 4. Section 172A.6, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1997,
15 is amended to read as follows:

18 secretary as provided in chapter ~~137A7-171~~ or 172 and who
19 purchases livestock for slaughter valued at less than an
20 average daily value of two thousand five hundred dollars
21 during the preceding twelve months or such part thereof as the
22 person was purchasing livestock. Said licensees are made
23 subject to this chapter as to the regulatory and penal
24 provisions hereof. All other provisions of this chapter shall
25 apply to said dealers or brokers.

26 Sec. 5. Section 173.3, Code 1997, is amended to read as
27 follows:

28 173.3 CERTIFICATION OF STATE AID ASSOCIATIONS.

29 On or before November 15 of each year, the secretary of
30 agriculture shall certify to the secretary of the state fair
31 board the names of the various associations and societies
32 which have qualified for state aid under the provisions of
33 chapters 176 through 178, ~~180-through-183~~ 181, 182, 186, and
34 352, and which are entitled to representation in the
35 convention as provided in section 173.2.

1 Sec. 6. Section 190.2, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1997,
2 is amended to read as follows:

3 The department may establish and publish standards for
4 foods when such standards are not fixed by law, ~~but the same.~~
5 The standards shall conform with those proclaimed standards
6 for foods adopted by the secretary of agriculture of federal
7 agencies including, but not limited to, the United States
8 department of agriculture.

9 Sec. 7. Section 198.9, subsection 3, unnumbered paragraph
10 2, Code 1997, is amended by striking the paragraph.

11 Sec. 8. Section 331.507, subsection 3, Code 1997, is
12 amended by striking the subsection.

13 Sec. 9. Chapters 171, 180, 183, and 190A, Code 1997, are
14 repealed.

15 Sec. 10. Sections 159.12, 159.18, 159.34, 160.11, 160.16,
16 172.5, 213.4, 213.5, 213.6, and 352.13, Code 1997, are
17 repealed.

18 Sec. 11. DIRECTIONS TO THE CODE EDITOR. The Code editor
19 shall transfer the provisions of chapter 196A to or near
20 chapter 184.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill amends a number of provisions relating to
23 agriculture and the department of agriculture and land
24 stewardship.

25 Code section 159.6 is amended by striking an internal Code
26 chapter reference to the regulation of Code storage facilities
27 which chapter is repealed later on in the bill.

28 Code section 159.20 is amended by striking a provision
29 which requires the department of agriculture and land
30 stewardship to establish an agricultural commodity
31 informational database.

32 Code section 190.2 is amended by providing that when the
33 department of agriculture and land stewardship adopts
34 standards for foods under Code chapter 190, the standards must
35 comply with standards adopted by any federal agencies, not

1 just the United States department of agriculture.

2 Code section 198.9 is amended by striking a provision
3 requiring the department of agriculture and land stewardship
4 to publish an annual report involving inspection fees for
5 commercial feed.

6 Code section 331.507 is amended by striking an internal
7 Code section reference requiring the auditor to collect a bee
8 entry fee which section is repealed later in the bill.

9 Code chapter 171 is repealed. The chapter regulates cold
10 storage plants by providing for licensure, examination of
11 plants, reporting, and penalties.

12 Code chapter 180 is repealed. The chapter authorizes the
13 Iowa state dairy association to hold an exposition of 4-H
14 dairy calves and contests.

15 Code chapter 183 is repealed. The chapter memorializes the
16 interstate compact on agricultural grain marketing.

17 Code chapter 190A is repealed. The chapter regulates
18 frozen desserts by providing for minimum requirements,
19 regulating fruit flavoring, providing labeling requirements,
20 prohibiting false advertising, requiring the posting of signs,
21 and providing for dry powder mixes.

22 Code section 159.12 is repealed. The section requires
23 persons answering departmental inquiries regarding
24 agricultural statistics to summarize and footnote their
25 responses.

26 Code section 159.18 is repealed. This section allows the
27 department to hold a state farmers institute, for the
28 discussion of practical and scientific topics relating to the
29 various branches of agriculture.

30 Code section 159.34 is repealed. The section authorizes
31 the department to establish standards for apples, and allows
32 for departmental inspections and certification of apples.

33 Code section 160.11 is repealed. The section provides that
34 regulations and orders adopted by the department in regulating
35 bee colonies under Code chapter 160 have the full force and

1 effect of law.

2 Code section 160.16 is repealed. The section requires that
3 each bee colony moved into Iowa from another state by a
4 nonresident be assessed a one dollar entry fee.

5 Code sections 213.4 through 213.6 are repealed. Code
6 chapter 213 regulates weights and measures related to
7 agricultural commodities. The repealed sections provide for
8 the sealing of bottles for milk or cream, the authority of a
9 city to appoint a sealer of weights and measures, and the duty
10 of a city sealer to provide for the safekeeping of city
11 standards.

12 Code section 352.13 is repealed. The section abolishes the
13 state interagency resource council which was charged to
14 receive and distribute information regarding land use
15 statistics by counties.

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1 Section 1. Section 159.6, subsection 7, Code 1997, is
