1 An Act making an appropriation to pay for salary supplements for
 2 nonsupervisory, professional full-time equivalent positions
 3 filled by community colleges.

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION -- STAFF DEVELOPMENT
2 FUND FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGES. There is appropriated from the
3 general fund of the state to the department of education for
4 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30,
5 1999, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
6 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

7 For salary supplements in the amount of \$2,000 for each
8 nonsupervisory, professional full-time equivalent position
9 filled at each community college:

10 \$ 4,000,000

11 By August 1, 1998, each community college shall certify to
12 the department of education the total number of
13 nonsupervisory, professional full-time equivalent positions
14 filled at each community college. If funds appropriated under
15 this section are insufficient for the purposes of this
16 section, the department of education shall prorate the funds
17 appropriated to the community colleges based upon each
18 community college's share of the total number of
19 nonsupervisory, professional full-time equivalent positions
20 filled by the community colleges.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill appropriates to the department of education, from
23 the general fund of the state, \$4 million to pay for salary
24 supplements in the amount of \$2,000 for each nonsupervisory,
25 professional full-time equivalent (FTE) position filled by
26 each community college. Each community college shall certify
27 the total number of nonsupervisory, professional full-time
28 equivalent positions it has filled, and the if the funds are
29 insufficient to pay \$2,000 for each FTE, the department is
30 directed to prorate the \$4 million to the community colleges
31 based upon each community college's share of the total number
32 of nonsupervisory, professional full-time equivalent positions
33 filled by the community colleges.
