1 An Act abolishing the county compensation board and transferring its duties to the board of supervisors. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: S.F. 249 2.2 TLSB 2277XS 77

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Section 1. Section 331.212, subsection 2, Code 1997, is 1 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph: 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. i. Setting the compensation schedule of 4 the elected county officers. 5 Sec. 2. Section 331.321, subsection 1, paragraph n, Code 6 1997, is amended by striking the paragraph. Sec. 3. Section 331.322, subsection 6, Code 1997, is 7 8 amended to read as follows: 9 Review Annually review and prepare the final 6. 10 compensation-schedule-of-the-county-compensation-board-and 11 determine-the-final compensation schedule in accordance with 12 section 331,907. 13 Sec. 4. Section 331.322, subsection 7, Code 1997, is 14 amended by striking the subsection. 15 Sec. 5. Section 331.323, subsection 1, unnumbered 16 paragraph 5, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows: 17 When if the duties of an officer or employee are assigned 18 to one or more elected officers, the board shall set the 19 initial salary for each elected officer---Thereafter,-the 20 salary-shall-be-determined as provided in section 331.907. 21 Sec. 6. Section 331.907, subsections 1 and 2, Code 1997, 22 are amended to read as follows: 23 1. The annual compensation of the auditor, treasurer, 24 recorder, sheriff, county attorney, and supervisors shall be 25 determined as provided in this section. The county-compen-26 sation board of supervisors annually shall review the 27 compensation paid to comparable officers in other counties of 28 this state, other states, private enterprise, and the federal 29 government. In setting the salary of the county sheriff, the 30 county-compensation board shall consider setting the sheriff's 31 salary so that it is comparable to salaries paid to 32 professional law enforcement administrators and command 33 officers of the Iowa highway safety patrol, the division of 34 criminal investigation of the department of public safety, and 35 city police agencies in this state. The county-compensation

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1 board shall prepare a compensation schedule for the elective 2 county officers for the succeeding fiscal year. A-recommended 3 compensation-schedule-requires-a A majority vote of the 4 membership of the county-compensation board <u>is required to</u> 5 <u>approve the compensation schedule</u>.

6 2. At the public hearing held on the county budget as 7 provided in section 331.434, the county-compensation board 8 shall submit its recommended compensation schedule for the 9 next fiscal year to-the-board-of-supervisors for inclusion in 10 the county budget. Whe-board-of-supervisors-shall-review-the 11 recommended-compensation-schedule-for-the-elected-county 12 officers-and-determine-the-final-compensation-schedule-which 13 shall-not-exceed-the-compensation-schedule-recommended-by-the 14 county-compensation-board---In-determining-the-final-compen-15 sation-schedule-if-the-board-of-supervisors-wishes-to-reduce 16 the amount of the recommended compensation schedule, the 17 amount-of-salary-increase-proposed-for-each-elected-county 18 officer-shall-be-reduced-an-equal-percentage- A copy of the 19 final compensation schedule shall be filed with the county 20 budget at the office of the director of the department of 21 management. The final compensation schedule takes effect on 22 July 1 following its adoption by the board of supervisors. 23 Sec. 7. Section 331.905, Code 1997, is repealed. 24 EXPLANATION

This bill abolishes the county compensation board and transfers to the county board of supervisors the duty of setting the compensation schedule for elective county 8 officers.

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
