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
EXPLANATION

This bill provides immunity from civil liability to an employer who provides work-related information about a current for former employee upon request of the employee or a prospective employer if the employer does not act unreasonably an providing the information. The bill provides that an employer acts unreasonably if the information disclosed violates a civil right of the employee, if the information is knowingly provided to one with no legitimate interest in the information, or if the information provided is not relevant and is disclosed with malice or with no good faith belief that the information is true.
