- 1 Section 1. Section 257.6, subsection 5, unnumbered
- 2 paragraph 1, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 Weighted enrollment is the budget enrollment plus the
- 4 district's additional enrollment because of special education
- 5 calculated on December 1 of the base year plus additional
- 6 pupils added due to the application of the supplementary
- 7 weighting pursuant to sections 257.11 and 257.13.
- 8 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 257.13 CLASS SIZE REDUCTION
- 9 WEIGHTING PROGRAM.
- 10 1. There is established a class size reduction weighting
- th program to provide additional funds for school districts that
- 12 develop a class size reduction plan. To be eligible for
- 13 supplementary weighting as provided in this section, a school
- 14 district shall submit annually by April 15 of the base year to
- 35 the department of education a plan which includes, at a
- 16 minimum, the goals of reducing class size in kindergarten and
- 17 grades one through three, instituting professional development
- 18 to assist teachers in teaching challenging curricula more
- 19 effectively, and engaging parents, teachers, school
- 20 administrators, and students in the achievement of the shared
- 21 goal of raising student achievement levels. In addition, the
- 22 plan shall provide for methods for measuring student
- 23 achievement and progress.
- 24 2. A pupil enrolled in a school district that meets the
- 25 requirements of subsection 1, and who is assigned to a self-
- 26 contained classroom in which the student-to-teacher ratio is
- 27 not more than fifteen students to one teacher, or the
- 28 equivalent in a school that utilizes team teaching methods,
- 29 and who is receiving at a minimum the grade-appropriate
- 30 educational program provided in accordance with section
- 31 256.1%, is assigned a supplementary weighting of two-tenths,
- 32 which is in addition to any weighting received under section
- 33 257.6, if the pupil is enrolled in and attending the
- 34 foll wing:
- 35 a. Full-day kindergarten, or a combined kindergarten and

- 1 grade one program, in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, 2 or in a succeeding fiscal year.
- b. Full-day kindergarten, or a combined kindergarten and 4 grade one program, or grade one in the fiscal year beginning 5 July 1, 1998, or in a succeeding fiscal year.
- 6 c. Full-day kindergarten, or a combined kindergarten and 7 grade one program, grade one, or grade two in the fiscal year 8 beginning July 1, 1999, or in a succeeding fiscal year.
- 9 d. Full-day kindergarten, or a combined kindergarten and 10 grade one program, grade one, grade two, or grade three in the 11 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, or in a succeeding fiscal 12 year.
- 13 3. A school district shall provide a separate accounting 14 of the pupils eligible for supplemental weighting in 15 accordance with this section, when certifying its actual 16 enrollment to the department of education.
- 17 Sec. 3. Section 298.2, Code 1997, is amended by adding the 18 following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 6. Notwithstanding subsection 1, the voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy in a school district may exceed the sixty-seven cents per thousand dollars of assessed valuation limit by twenty-five cents if the levy
- 23 exceeding sixty-seven cents per thousand dollars of assessed
- 24 valuation is established by a school district that has
- 25 developed a class size reduction plan pursuant to section
- 26 257.13. The revenue from the levy above the sixty-seven cent
- 27 limit provided for in subsection 1 shall be used for purposes
- 28 of facilities-related costs associated with reducing class
- 29 size in kindergarten and grades one through three.
- 30 Sec. 4. This Act takes effect July 1, 1997, for
- 31 computations required for the school year beginning July 1,
- 32 1998.

## 33 EXPLANATION

34 This bill establishes a class size reduction weighting 35 program to provide additional funds for school districts that

     The bill begins by assigning a supplemental weighting of
11 0.2 to full-day kindergarten students in the fiscal year
12 beginning July !, 1997, and adds one grade per year until by
13 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, all full-day
14 kindergarten through grade three pupils in self-contained
is classrooms in which the student-to-teacher ratio is not more
16 than 15 students to one teacher, or the equivalent in a school
17 that utilizes team teaching methods, are assigned a
18 supplementary weighting of 0.2.
     The bill permits the voter-approved physical plant and

20 equipment levy to exceed the current limit of 0.67 cents by
21 0.25 cents per $1,000 of assessed valuation in the district
22 for school districts participating in the class size reduction
23 program.
