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- 1 Section 1. Section 257.9, subsection 2, Code 1997, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- REGULAR PROGRAM STATE COST PER PUPIL FOR 1992-1993 AND
- 4 SUCCEEDING-YEARS THROUGH 1997-1998. For the budget year
- 5 beginning July 1, 1992, and succeeding budget years until June
- 6 30, 1998, the regular program state cost per pupil for a
- 7 budget year is the regular program state cost per pupil for
- 8 the base year plus the regular program allowable growth for
- 9 the budget year.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 257.9, Code 1997, is amended by adding the
- 11 following new subsections:
- 12 NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. REGULAR PROGRAM STATE COST PER PUPIL
- 13 FOR 1998-1999. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1998,
- 14 the regular program state cost per pupil is the regular
- 15 program state cost per pupil for the budget year beginning
- 16 July 1, 1998, determined under section 257.9, subsection 2,
- 17 Code 1997, minus the transportation cost increment.
- 18 For the purpose of this subsection, the transportation cost
- 19 increment is determined as follows:
- 20 a. Calculate the sum of all school districts' actual
- 21 transportation costs for all children transported in all
- 22 school buses for the base year pursuant to section 285.1,
- 23 subsection 12, minus the total amount districts received for
- 24 transporting nonpublic school pupils under section 285.1, and
- 25 divide that sum by the statewide budget enrollment for the
- 26 base year.
- 27 b. Add an allowable growth amount determined by
- 28 multiplying the state percent of growth by the sum obtained in
- 29 paragraph "a".
- 30 NEW SUBSECTION. 2B. REGULAR PROGRAM STATE COST PER PUPIL
- 31 FOR 1999-2000 AND SUCCEEDING YEARS. For the budget year
- 32 beginning July 1, 1999, and succeeding budget years, the
- 33 regular program state cost per pupil for a budget year is the
- 34 regular program state cost per pupil for the base year plus
- 35 the regular program allowable growth for the budget year.

- 1 Sec. 3. Section 257.10, subsection 2, Code 1997, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 2. REGULAR PROGRAM DISTRICT COST PER PUPIL FOR 1992-1993
- 4 AND-SUCCEEDING-YEARS THROUGH 1997-1998.
- 5 a. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1992, and
- 6 succeeding budget years until June 30, 1998, the regular
- 7 program district cost per pupil for each school district for a
- 8 budget year is the regular program district cost per pupil for
- 9 the base year plus the regular program allowable growth for
- 10 the budget year except as otherwise provided in this
- 11 subsection.
- b. If the regular program district cost per pupil of a
- 13 school district for the budget year under paragraph "a"
- 14 exceeds one hundred five percent of the regular program state
- 15 cost per pupil for the budget year and the state percent of
- 16 growth for the budget year is greater than two percent, the
- 17 regular program district cost per pupil for the budget year
- 18 for that district shall be reduced to one hundred five percent
- 19 of the regular program state cost per pupil for the budget
- 20 year. However, if the difference between the regular program
- 21 district cost per pupil for the budget year and the regular
- 22 program state cost per pupil for the budget year is greater
- 23 than an amount equal to two percent multiplied by the regular
- 24 program state cost per pupil for the base year, the regular
- 25 program district cost per pupil for the budget year shall be
- 26 reduced by the amount equal to two percent multiplied by the
- 27 regular program state cost per pupil for the base year.
- Sec. 4. Section 257.10, Code 1997, is amended by adding
- 29 the following new subsection:
- 30 NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. REGULAR PROGRAM DISTRICT COST PER
- 31 PUPIL FOR 1998-1999. For the budget year beginning July 1,
- 32 1998, the regular program district cost per pupil for a
- 33 district is the regular program district cost per pupil for
- 34 the budget year beginning July 1, 1998, calculated under
- 35 section 257.10, subsection 2, Code 1997, minus the district

- 1 transportation cost increment. For the purpose of this
- 2 subsection, the district transportation cost increment is
- 3 calculated as follows:
- 4 a. Calculate the sum of the district's actual
- 5 transportation costs for all children transported in all
- 6 school buses in the district for the base year pursuant to
- 7 section 285.1, subsection 12, minus the amount the district
- 8 received for transporting nonpublic school pupils under
- 9 section 285.1, divided by the district's budget enrollment for
- 10 the base year.
- b. Add the allowable growth amount calculated in section
- 12 257.9, subsection 2A.
- 13 NEW SUBSECTION. 2B. REGULAR PROGRAM DISTRICT COST PER
- 14 PUPIL FOR 1999-2000 AND SUCCEEDING YEARS. For the budget year
- 15 beginning July 1, 1999, and succeeding budget years, the
- 16 regular program district cost per pupil for a budget year is
- 17 the regular program district cost per pupil for the base year
- 18 plus the regular program allowable growth for the budget year.
- 19 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 257.50 STATE AID FOR
- 20 TRANSPORTATION.
- 1. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1998, and
- 22 succeeding budget years, there is appropriated from the
- 23 general fund of the state to the department of management for
- 24 distribution to school districts which provide transportation
- 25 to the public pupils pursuant to chapter 285 an amount
- 26 sufficient to pay state transportation aid for such
- 27 transportation at the following rates:
- 28 a. Thirty dollars per school year per elementary pupil
- 29 transported whose residence is at least two miles and not more
- 30 than five miles from the school attended, and per high school
- 31 pupil transported whose residence is at least three miles and
- 32 not more than five miles from the school attended.
- 33 b. Forty-five dollars per school year per elementary or
- 34 high school pupil transported whose residence is at least five
- 35 miles and not more than eight miles from the school attended.

- c. Sixty dollars per school year per elementary or high
 school pupil transported whose residence is at least eight
 miles and not more than twelve miles from the school attended.
- 4 d. Sixty-eight dollars per school year per elementary or 5 high school pupil transported whose residence is at least 6 twelve miles and not more than fifteen miles from the school 7 attended.
- 8 e. Seventy-five dollars per school year per elementary or 9 high school pupil transported whose residence is at least 10 fifteen miles and not more than eighteen miles from the school 11 attended.
- 12 f. Eighty-five dollars per school year per elementary or 13 high school pupil transported whose residence is more than 14 eighteen miles from the school attended.
- 2. State aid paid pursuant to subsection 1 shall be
 16 utilized to pay for the cost of transportation directly
 17 provided by a school district or to compensate a district for
 18 reimbursement expenses. State aid shall not exceed the actual
 19 transportation costs incurred by a school district for the
 20 school year, and shall be reduced proportionately in the case
 21 of a pupil transported for less than a full school year due to
 22 relocation to another school district or change in enrollment
 23 status.
- 3. A school district shall annually certify mileage
 25 figures to the department by the third Friday in September,
 26 beginning with the third Friday in September 1997, for use in
 27 budget calculations for the following budget year.
- 4. State aid paid pursuant to subsection 1 is
 miscellaneous income and shall be paid together with state
 foundation aid paid under section 257.16.
- 5. For the purposes of this section, "high school" means32 high school as defined in section 285.1, subsection 1.EXPLANATION
- This bill provides that the calculation of state aid for transportation costs incurred by school districts in

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1 transporting public elementary and high school pupils to and 2 from school pursuant to Code chapter 285 is changed beginning 3 with the budget year beginning with July 1, 1998. Money is 4 appropriated for districts to receive aid for transportation 5 costs calculated as a dollar amount per pupil per school year 6 based on the distances traveled between the pupil's residence 7 and the school. Currently, transportation costs for public 8 school pupils are incorporated into the state school 9 foundation formula. The bill provides that the department of 10 management shall recalculate state cost per pupil and district 11 per pupil by subtracting transportation costs per pupil from 12 those figures. The bill provides that state aid for transportation shall 13 14 not exceed the actual transportation cost incurred by a 15 district, and shall be reduced proportionately in the case of 16 a pupil transported for less than a full school year due to 17 relocation or change in enrollment status. The transportation 18 aid is miscellaneous income for purposes of the state school 19 foundation formula. 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34
