1 An Act relating to the criteria for issuance of handicapped special plates and making a civil penalty applicable. 2 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 8 9 10 11 12

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.34, subsection 14, Code 1997, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 14. HANDICAPPED SPECIAL PLATES. An owner referred to in
- 4 subsection 12 who is a handicapped person, or who is the
- 5 parent or guardian of a child who resides with the parent or
- 6 guardian owner and who is a handicapped person, as defined in
- 7 section 321L.1, may, upon written application to the
- 8 department, order special registration plates with a
- 9 handicapped processed emblem designed by the department
- 10 bearing the international symbol of accessibility. The
- 11 special registration plates with a handicapped processed
- 12 emblem shall only be issued if the application is accompanied
- 13 with a statement from a physician licensed under chapter 148,
- 14 149, 150, or 150A, a physician assistant licensed under
- 15 chapter 148C, an advanced registered nurse practitioner
- 16 licensed under chapter 152, or a chiropractor licensed under
- 17 chapter 151, written on the physician's, physician
- 18 assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or chiropractor's
- 19 stationery, stating the nature of the applicant's or the
- 20 applicant's child's handicap and such additional information
- 21 as required by rules adopted by the department, including
- 22 proof of residency of a child who is a handicapped person. If
- 23 the application is approved by the department the special
- 24 registration plates with a handicapped processed emblem shall
- 25 be issued to the applicant. There shall be no fee in addition
- 26 to the regular annual registration fee for the special
- 27 registration plates with a handicapped processed emblem. The
- 28 authorization for special registration plates with a
- 29 handicapped processed emblem shall not be renewed without the
- 30 applicant furnishing evidence to the department that the owner
- 31 of the motor vehicle or the owner's child is still a
- 32 handicapped person as defined in section 321L.1. An owner who
- 33 has a child who is a handicapped person shall provide
- 34 satisfactory evidence to the department that the handicapped
- 35 child continues to reside with the owner. The registration

2 surrendered in exchange for regular registration plates as

10 A handicapped resident of the state desiring a handicapped
11 parking permit shall apply to the department upon an
12 application form furnished by the department providing the
13 applicant's name, address, date of birth, and social security

- 12 application form furnished by the department providing the 13 applicant's name, address, date of birth, and social security 14 number and shall also provide a statement from a physician 15 licensed under chapter 148, 149, 150, or 150A, a physician 16 assistant licensed under chapter 148C, an advanced registered 17 nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 152, or a 18 chiropractor licensed under chapter 151, or a physician, 19 physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or chiropractor 20 licensed to practice in a contiguous state, written on the 21 physician's, physician assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or 22 chiropractor's stationery, stating the nature of the 23 applicant's handicap and such additional information as 24 required by rules adopted by the department under section 25 321L.8. If the person is applying for a temporary handicapped 26 parking permit, the physician's, physician assistant's, nurse 27 practitioner's, or chiropractor's statement shall state the 28 period of time during which the person is expected to be 29 handicapped and the period of time for which the permit should 30 be issued, not to exceed six months.
- 31 Sec. 3. Section 321L.2, subsection 1, paragraph a, 32 subparagraph (3), Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 33 (3) Removable windshield placard. A handicapped person 34 may apply for a temporary removable windshield placard which 35 shall be valid for a period of up to six months, as determined

- 1 by the physician's, physician assistant's, nurse
- 2 practitioner's, or chiropractor's statement under this
- 3 subsection or a removable windshield placard which shall be
- 4 valid for a period of four years from the date of issuance. A
- 5 removable windshield placard shall be renewed within thirty
- 6 days of the date of expiration. To renew the placard, the
- 7 person shall comply with the requirements for initial issuance
- 8 of the placard under this section. Persons seeking temporary
- 9 removable windshield placards shall be required to furnish

- 24 practitioner, or chiropractor who provides false information
- 25 with the intent to defraud on the physician's, physician
- 26 assistant's, nurse practitioner's, or chiropractor's statement
- 27 used in establishing proof under subsection 1 is subject to a
- 28 civil penalty of three hundred dollars which may be imposed by
- 29 the department. In addition to the civil penalty, the
- 30 department shall revoke the permit issued pursuant to this
- 31 section.
- 32 Sec. 5. Section 321L.2, subsection 3, paragraph b,
- 33 subparagraph 3, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 34 (3) The signature of the person who has been issued the
- 35 placard and the signature of the physician, physician

1 assistant, nurse practitioner, or chiropractor who made the 2 determination that the person was handicapped for purposes of 3 issuance of the placard. **EXPLANATION** This bill provides that handicapped parking permits may be 6 issued pursuant to the statement of a physician assistant or 7 nurse practitioner. Currently, only physicians and 8 chiropractors may provide information to the department 9 regarding the disability of the person seeking the handicapped 10 permit.
