3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

6 following new subsection:

7 NEW SUBSECTION. 6A. A licensee shall not claim as an
8 expense more than one percent of the cash value of all checks
9 accepted by the licensee and dishonored by the financial
10 institutions upon which the checks were drawn during the
11 preceding fiscal year.

12 Sec. 3. Section 99D.11, subsection 7, Code 1997, is

12 veterinarian must deposit with the commission veterinarian at
13 the detention barn an unopened supply of lasix and sterile
14 hypodermic needles and syringes to be used for the
15 administrations deliver an affidavit to the commission which
16 is signed by the veterinarian and certifies information
17 regarding the treatment of the horse. The affidavit must be
18 delivered to a commission veterinarian within twenty minutes

31 unauthorized drugs or hypodermic needles or who is not
32 authorized to possess drugs or hypodermic needles shall, in
33 addition to any other penalties, be barred from entry into any
34 racetrack in Iowa and any occupational license the person
35 holds shall be revoked.

20 the parents or guardians of a person who has violated this
21 subsection of the violation and suspension.

28 dollars. Failure to pay the fine by a person under the age of

32 paid under this subsection shall be retained by the city or
33 county enforcing the violation.

34 Sec. 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 6 of this Act, being
35 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

EXPLANATION

1

2 This bill authorizes the racing and gaming commission to
3 set fines for pari-mutuel violations of chapter 99D consistent
4 with its authority under chapter 99F for excursion gambling
5 boat gambling violations. The \$1,000 limit is removed.

6 The bill strikes language associated with a state loan to
7 the Waterloo greyhound racetrack. The racetrack is no longer
8 in operation and the loan has been repaid.

9 The bill also allows a horse to be treated with lasix in
10 the horse's stall unless the racing and gaming commission
11 requires treatment in a detention barn. The bill also
12 requires the commission to adopt rules to ensure the lawful
13 administration of the lasix. The veterinarian administering
14 the lasix shall provide an affidavit relating to the horse's
15 treatment. The penalty for illegal administration of drugs to
16 race horses or dogs is a class "D" felony.

17 This bill prohibits a licensee of a pari-mutuel racetrack
18 or an excursion gambling boat from permitting the operation of
19 a satellite banking terminal where pari-mutuel wagering is
20 conducted within the racetrack enclosure or on the excursion
21 gambling boat where gambling is conducted to provide cash or
22 credit for gambling.

23 This bill also imposes a \$100 scheduled fine on a person
24 under 21 years of age who attempts to gamble or gambles on an
25 excursion gambling boat or at a racetrack enclosure, who
26 attempts to purchase or purchases a lottery ticket or share,
27 or who attempts to place or places a pari-mutuel wager. In
28 addition, a violator is subject to suspension of the person's
29 motor vehicle operator's license for 60 days, or if the
30 violator does not possess a motor vehicle operator's license,
31 to 50 hours of community service. For a second offense, the
32 motor vehicle license shall be suspended for 60 days, or the
33 person shall perform 50 hours of community service or pay a
34 civil penalty of \$200. For a third or subsequent offense, the
35 motor vehicle license shall be suspended for one year, the

1 person shall perform 100 hours of community service, or the
2 person shall pay a civil penalty of \$300. The clerk of the
3 district court is directed to attempt to notify the violator's
4 parents or guardians of the violation and suspension.

9 section 99D.11, subsection 7, section 99E.18, subsection 5, or
10 section 99F.9, subsection 5, the scheduled fine is one hundred
11 dollars. Failure to pay the fine by a person under the age of
12 eighteen shall not result in the person being detained in a
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16 EXPLANATION

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4 under 21 years of age who attempts to gamble or gambles on an
5 excursion gambling boat or at a racetrack enclosure, who
6 attempts to purchase or purchases a lottery ticket or share,
7 or who attempts to place or places a pari-mutuel wager. In
8 addition, a violator is subject to suspension of the person's
9 motor vehicle operator's license for 60 days, or if the
10 violator does not possess a motor vehicle operator's license,
11 to 50 hours of community service. The clerk of the district
12 court is directed to attempt to notify the violator's parents
13 or guardians of the violation and suspension.

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
