- 1 Section 1. Section 56.5A, Code 1997, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 56.5A CANDIDATE'S COMMITTEE.
- 4 1. Each candidate for state, county, city, or school
- 5 office shall organize one, and only one, candidate's committee
- 6 for a specific office sought when the candidate receives
- 7 contributions in excess of five hundred dollars in the
- 8 aggregate, makes expenditures in excess of five hundred
- 9 dollars in the aggregate, or incurs indebtedness in excess of
- 10 five hundred dollars in the aggregate in a calendar year.
- 11 2. A political committee shall not be established to
