**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to the disposition of emergency medical care  
2 provider certification fees.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 147A.6, subsection 1, Code 1997, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. The department, upon application and receipt of the  
4 prescribed fee, shall issue a certificate to an individual who  
5 has met all of the requirements for emergency medical care  
6 provider certification established by the rules adopted under  
7 section 147A.4, subsection 2. All fees received pursuant to  
8 this section shall be deposited in the emergency medical  
9 services fund established in section 135.25.

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EXPLANATION

This bill provides that certification fees paid to the  
department of public health by emergency medical care  
providers are to be deposited in the emergency medical  
services fund established in section 135.25. Moneys in this  
fund are to be used to assist counties by matching, on a  
dollar-for-dollar basis, moneys spent by a county for the  
acquisition of equipment for the provision of emergency  
medical services and to provide grants to counties for  
education and training in the delivery of emergency medical  
services.
