
- 1 Section 1. Section 462A.7, subsection 2 Code 1997 is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. Whenever any vessel is involved in a collision,
- 4 accident or casualty, except one which results only in
- 5 property damage not exceeding one five hundred dollars, a
- 6 report thereof shall be filed with the commission. The report
- 7 shall be filed by the operator of the vessel and shall contain
- 8 such information as the commission may, by rule, require.
- 9 Said The report shall be submitted without delay in death or
- 10 disappearance cases and within five days in all other cases.
- 11 Sec. 2. Section 462A.7, subsection 4, Code 1997, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 4. All reports shall be in writing, and the written report
- 14 shall be without prejudice to the individual so-reporting-and
- 15 shall-be-for-the-confidential-use-of-the-commission who
- 16 submits the report. However, -upon-request-the-commission
- 17 shall-disclose-the-identities-of-the-persons-on-board-the
- 18 vessels-involved-in-the-occurrence-and-their-addresses. A
- 19 written report filed with the commission shall be made
- 20 available to any party to an accident, the party's insurance
- 21 company or its agent, the party's attorney, or the attorney
- 22 general, on written request to the department and the payment
- 23 of a fee for each copy. A written report shall not be
- 24 admissible in or used in evidence in any civil or criminal
- 25 action arising out of the facts on which the report is based.
- 26 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE -- APPLICABILITY.
- 27 l. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes
- 28 effect upon enactment.
- 29 2. Section 1 of this Act applies to written reports of
- 30 accidents involving water and ice vessel accidents occurring
- 31 on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 This bill provides that written reports of accidents
- 34 involving water or ice vessels, which are submitted to the
- 35 natural resource commission of the department of natural

1 resources, are to be made available to the parties to the 2 accident or to the parties' attorneys or insurance companies, 3 or to the attorney general, upon payment of a copy fee. 4 bill also increases from \$100 to \$500 the threshold amount of 5 property damage required before a report must be filed. This bill takes effect upon enactment. Section 1 which 7 requires the filing of a vessel accident report if the damage 8 exceeds \$500, applies to accidents occurring on or after the 9 effective date of the bill.

Amend Senate File 95 as follows: Page 1, by striking lines 13 through 25 and 3 inserting the following: "4. a. All reports shall be in writing, and the 5 written-report-shall-be-without-prejudice-to-the 6 individual-so-reporting-and. A vessel operator's 7 report shall be without prejudice to the person making 8 the report and shall be for the confidential use of 9 the commission department. However, upon request the 10 commission department shall disclose the identities of ll the persons on board the vessels involved in the 12 occurrence and their addresses. Upon request of a 13 person who made and filed a vessel operator's report, 14 the department shall provide a copy of the vessel 15 operator's report to the requestor. A written vessel 16 operator's report filed with the commission department 17 shall not be admissible in or used in evidence in any 18 civil or criminal action arising out of the facts on 19 which the report is based. 20 All written reports filed by law enforcement 21 officers as required under section 462A.7, subsection 22 3, are confidential to the extent provided in section 23 22.7, subsection 5, and section 622.11. However, a 24 completed law enforcement officer's report shall be 25 made available by the department or the investigating 26 law enforcement agency to any party to a boating 27 accident, collision, or other casualty, the party's 28 insurance company or its agent, or the party's 29 attorney on written request and payment of a fee." 
AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER AND ICE VESSEL ACCIDENT REPORTS FILED WITH THE NATURAL RESOURCE COMMISSION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND THE ACT'S APPLICABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 462A.7, subsection 2, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:

2. Whenever any vessel is involved in a collision, accident or casualty, except one which results only in



property damage not exceeding one <u>five</u> hundred dollars, a report thereof shall be filed with the commission. The report shall be filed by the operator of the vessel and shall contain such information as the commission may, by rule, require.

Said <u>The</u> report shall be submitted without delay in death or disappearance cases and within five days in all other cases.

Sec. 2. Section 462A.7, subsection 4, Code 1997, is amended to read as follows:

- 4. a. All reports shall be in writingy-and-the-written report-shall-be-without-prejudice-to-the-individual-so reporting-and. A vessel operator's report shall be without prejudice to the person making the report and shall be for the confidential use of the commission department. However, upon request the commission department shall disclose the identities of the persons on board the vessels involved in the occurrence and their addresses. Upon request of a person who made and filed a vessel operator's report, the department shall provide a copy of the vessel operator's report to the requestor. A written vessel operator's report filed with the commission department shall not be admissible in or used in evidence in any civil or criminal action arising out of the facts on which the report is based.
- b. All written reports filed by law enforcement officers as required under section 462A.7, subsection 3, are confidential to the extent provided in section 22.7, subsection 5, and section 622.11. However, a completed law enforcement officer's report shall be made available by the department or the investigating law enforcement agency to any party to a boating accident, collision, or other casualty, the party's insurance company or its agent, or the party's attorney on written request and payment of a fee.
 - Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE -- APPLICABILITY.
- This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

2. Section 1 of this Act applies to written reports of accidents involving water and ice vessel accidents occurring on or after the effective date of this Act.
