		planning cabling layouts, and locating, relocating,
		installing, or removing telecommunications and electric cable
		including peripheral equipment on the state capitol complex.
		The proceeds of the revolving fund include appropriations from
		the general assembly and any other moneys obtained or
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2 22 available to the department to carry out the purposes of the 2 3 revolving fund. 2 24 The second revolving fund is an art restoration and 2 25 preservation revolving fund to be used by the department of 2 26 general services to provide for the restoration, preservation, 2 7 rehabilitation, or enhancement of art and artifacts of 2 8 historical or cultural significance or artistic value located 2 9 in the public areas of the state capitol building.
