                                 EXPLANATION
  3 12
         This bill abolishes the county compensation board and
  3 13 transfers to the county board of supervisors the duty of
  3 14 setting the compensation schedule for elective county
  3 15 officers. The bill also authorizes the board of supervisors
  3 16 to appoint an advisory committee of five members to assist in
  3 17 determining salaries for elective county officers. Two
  3 18 members are selected by the board of supervisors and three
  3 19 members are appointed to represent a labor association, a farm
  3 20 organization, and a chamber of commerce. Each of the three
  3 21 types of organizations are invited by the board of supervisors
  3 22 to appoint a member to the advisory committee.
          The bill abolishes the commission on compensation,
  3 24 expenses, and salaries for elected state officials. The
  3 25 current Code establishes the 15-member commission, requires
  3 26 the commission to report biennially, sets forth provisions
  3 27 relating to the commission members' terms and the expenses of
  3 28 the commission, and requires the general assembly to consider
  3 29 the recommendations of the commission. Action by the general
  3 30 assembly is required to change the salaries of the elected
 3 31 officials.

          The current provisions require the commission to review the
  3 33 compensation and expenses received by members of the general
  3 34 assembly and the salaries of the other elective state
  3 35 officials, and compare the compensation, expenses, and
    1 salaries to those of comparable positions in other states, the
    2 federal government, and private enterprise. Under the current
    3 Code, the commission is required to make its determination as
    4 to compensation and expense levels for the members of the
    5 general assembly and for the other elective state officials
    6 and to submit a recommendation to the governor and the general
    7 assembly.
