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A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the licensing of certified professional
2 midwives, establishing the board of professional midwife
3 examiners, and prohibiting the use of the title certified
4 professional midwife without a license.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 147.1, subsections 3 and 6, Code 1999, 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3. "Licensed" or "certified" when applied to a physician
- 4 and surgeon, podiatric physician, osteopath, osteopathic
- 5 physician and surgeon, physician assistant, psychologist or
- 6 associate psychologist, chiropractor, nurse, dentist, dental
- 7 hygienist, optometrist, speech pathologist, audiologist,
- 8 pharmacist, physical therapist, occupational therapist,
- 9 respiratory care practitioner, practitioner of cosmetology
- 10 arts and sciences, practitioner of barbering, funeral
- 11 director, dietitian, marital and family therapist, mental
- 12 health counselor, social worker, massage therapist, or
- 13 athletic trainer, or certified professional midwife, means a
- 14 person licensed under this subtitle.
- 15 6. "Profession" means medicine and surgery, podiatry,
- 16 osteopathy, osteopathic medicine and surgery, practice as a
- 17 physician assistant, psychology, chiropractic, nursing,
- 18 dentistry, dental hygiene, optometry, speech pathology,
- 19 audiology, pharmacy, physical therapy, occupational therapy,
- 20 respiratory care, cosmetology arts and sciences, barbering,
- 21 mortuary science, marital and family therapy, mental health
- 22 counseling, social work, dietetics, massage therapy, or
- 23 athletic training, or certified professional midwifery.
- Sec. 2. Section 147.13, Code 1999, is amended by adding
- 25 the following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 21. For certified professional midwifery,
- 27 certified professional midwife examiners.
- Sec. 3. Section 147.14, Code 1999, is amended by adding
- 29 the following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 21. For certified professional midwife
- 31 examiners, three members licensed as certified professional
- 32 midwives, one member who is licensed under chapter 148, 150,
- 33 or 150A and is practicing in obstetrics or who is an advanced
- 34 registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 152 who
- 35 is a certified nurse midwife, and one member who is not a

- 1 licensed certified professional midwife or a licensed health
- 2 care provider who has received professional midwifery services
- 3 and who shall represent the general public.
- 4 Sec. 4. Section 147.74, Code 1999, is amended by adding
- 5 the following new subsection:
- 6 | NEW SUBSECTION. 20A. A certified professional midwife
- 7 licensed under chapter 154E may use the words "certified
- 8 professional midwife" or the initials "C.P.M." after the
- 9 person's name.
- 10 Sec. 5. Section 147.80, Code 1999, is amended by adding
- 11 the following new subsection:
- 12 NEW SUBSECTION. 27A. License to practice certified
- 13 professional midwifery upon the basis of an examination given
- 14 by the board of certified professional midwife examiners,
- 15 license to practice professional midwifery under a reciprocal
- 16 agreement, and renewal of a license to practice professional
- 17 midwifery.
- 18 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 154E.1 DEFINITIONS.
- 19 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 20 requires:
- 21 | 1. "Board" means the board of certified professional
- 22 midwife examiners established in section 147.13.
- 23 2. "Certified professional midwife" means a person who is
- 24 licensed to practice professional midwifery under chapter 147
- 25 and this chapter.
- 26 ; 3. "Department" means the Iowa department of public
- 27 health.
- 28 | 4. "Out-of-hospital" means any facility, institution, or
- 29 place which is not an ambulatory surgical center or a
- 30 hospital, such as a birth center as defined in section 135G.2
- 31 or a private home.
- 32 | 5. "Practice of certified professional midwifery" means
- 33 the provision of midwifery services including advising,
- 34 attending, or assisting a woman during pregnancy, labor,
- 35 childbirth, or the postpartum period by a person who is

- 1 neither licensed to practice under chapter 148, 150, or 150A
- 2 nor a nurse recognized by the Iowa board of nursing as an
- 3 advanced registered nurse practitioner who is a certified
- 4 nurse midwife, and who is not rendering emergency services
- 5 without compensation.
- 6 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 154E.2 LICENSURE -- CERTIFIED
- 7 PROFESSIONAL MIDWIFERY.
- 8 An applicant for a license to practice certified
- 9 professional midwifery shall be granted a license by the board
- 10 when the applicant satisfies all of the following
- 11 requirements:
- 12 1. Has fulfilled national certification requirements of
- 13 the North American registry of midwives or its successor
- 14 organization.
- 15 2. Has completed an apprenticeship period under the
- 16 supervision of a certified professional midwife, or has
- 17 completed a course of instruction in midwifery, to be
- 18 established by the board and the department by rule.
- 19 3. Has passed an examination administered by the board.
- 20 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 154E.3 BOARD ORGANIZATION AND
- 21 AUTHORITY.
- 22 1. In addition to duties and responsibilities provided in
- 23 chapters 147 and 272C, the board and the department shall
- 24 adopt rules relating to:
- 25 a. Standards required for persons engaging in the practice
- 26 of certified professional midwifery.
- 27 b. Standards for professional conduct of persons licensed
- 28 under this chapter.
- 29 c. The administration of this chapter.
- 30 d. The application of the certification requirements of
- 31 the North American registry of midwives or its successor
- 32 organization to criteria for licensure as a certified
- 33 professional midwife.
- e. Procedures for the issuance, renewal, and removal of
- 35 persons licensed under this chapter based on qualifications,

- 1 standards, and scope of practice established by the North
 2 American registry of midwives or its successor organization.
- f. Apprenticeship and courses of instruction as provided
- 4 in section 154E.2.
- 5 g. The maintenance of a registry of certified professional 6 midwives and statistics on the practice of certified 7 professional midwifery utilizing vital statistics data.
- 2. In establishing rules, the department and the board shall consult with persons knowledgeable regarding the prenatal and postpartum birth process, particularly those possessing experience with out-of-hospital births, including but not limited to persons licensed under chapters 148, 150, and 150A, certified professional midwives, advanced registered nurse practitioners who are certified nurse midwives, and somen who have given birth in an out-of-hospital setting.
- Sec. 9. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 154E.4 CLIENT DISCLOSURE.

 17 Prior to accepting a patient for certified professional
 18 midwifery care, a certified professional midwife shall provide
 19 information indicating all of the following:
- 20 | 1. Evidence that the care provider is a licensed certified 21 professional midwife meeting the requirements of this chapter.
- 22 | 2. The certified professional midwife's educational23 background and relevant experience, including experience in24 various birth settings.
- 3. The nature, scope, and location of the care to be 26 given, including the possibility of and the guidelines for 27 transfer of the patient, newborn child, or both, to a hospital 28 from an out-of-hospital setting.
- 29 Sec. 10. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 154E.5 EXCEPTIONS.
- 1. The practice of certified professional midwifery by a 31 certified professional midwife licensed pursuant to this 32 chapter shall constitute the licensed practice of midwifery. 33 However, nothing in this chapter is intended to require a 34 midwife to become licensed as described in this chapter.
- 35 2. The practice of certified professional midwifery by a

- 1 certified professional midwife licensed pursuant to this
- 2 chapter does not constitute the practice of medicine and
- 3 surgery under chapter 148, the practice of osteopathy under
- 4 chapter 150, the practice of osteopathic medicine and surgery
- 5 under chapter 150A, or the practice of nursing under chapter 6 152.
- 7 3. This chapter and chapter 147 do not prevent qualified
- 8 members of other professions, including but not limited to,
- 9 individuals licensed under chapter 148, 150, 150A, or 152 from
- 10 providing services consistent with the nature of certified
- 11 professional midwifery, but these persons shall not use a
- 12 title or description denoting that they are certified
- 13 professional midwives.
- 14 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 154E.6 LIABILITY.
- Persons licensed under chapters 148, 150, 150A, and 152,
- 16 and other licensed health care providers shall not be held
- 17 liable for the acts or omissions of a certified professional
- 18 midwife when they render birth-related services to the client
- 19 of a certified professional midwife. The liability of those
- 20 licensed individuals in rendering care or assistance in good
- 21 faith to a client of a certified professional midwife is
- 22 limited to damages caused by the licensed individual's own
- 23 gross negligence or willful or wanton acts or omissions.
- 24 Sec. 12. Section 272C.1, subsection 6, Code 1999, is
- 25 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 26 NEW PARAGRAPH. ad. The board of certified professional
- 27 midwife examiners, created pursuant to chapter 147.
- 28 Sec. 13. INITIAL BOARD.
- 29 l. Notwithstanding section 147.14, initial professional
- 30 appointees to the certified professional midwife examiners
- 31 shall fulfill the national certification requirements of the
- 32 North American registry of midwives.
- 33 2. Notwithstanding section 147.14, of the initial
- 34 appointments to the board of certified professional midwife
- 35 examiners, one member shall be appointed for a one-year term,

1 one member shall be appointed for a two-year term, and one 2 member shall be appointed for a three-year term. The member 3 who is licensed under chapter 148, 150, 150A, or 152 shall be 4 appointed for a two-year term and the member representing the 5 general public shall be appointed to a three-year term.

EXPLANATION

This bill provides for the licensing of certified 8 professional midwives. The bill provides that the practice of 9 certified professional midwifery refers to the provision of 10 midwifery services including advising, attending, or assisting 11 a woman during pregnancy, labor, childbirth, or the postpartum 12 period by a person who is not licensed to practice medicine 13 and surgery, osteopathy, osteopathic medicine and surgery, or 14 a nurse recognized by the Iowa board of nursing as an advanced 15 registered nurse practitioner who is a certified nurse 16 midwife, and who is not rendering emergency services without 17 compensation. An applicant for a license to practice 18 certified professional midwifery shall fulfill national 19 certification requirements of the North American registry of 20 midwives or its successor organization, complete an 21 apprenticeship period under the supervision of a certified 22 professional midwife or complete a course of instruction to be 23 established by the Iowa department of public health by rule, 24 and pass an examination administered by the board of certified 25 professional midwife examiners.

The bill provides for the establishment of a board of certified professional midwife examiners responsible for establishing rules regarding the licensing and practice of certified professional midwifery, and makes changes in Code chapter 147 consistent with the establishment of the new board. In establishing rules, the bill provides that the board shall consult with persons knowledgeable regarding the prenatal and postpartum birth process, particularly those possessing experience with out-of-hospital births, including but not limited to physicians and surgeons, osteopathic

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1 physicians, osteopathic physicians and surgeons, certified 2 professional midwives, certified nurse midwives, and women who 3 have given birth in an out-of-hospital setting. The bill 4 provides that information relating to the qualification and 5 experience of the certified professional midwife, the nature 6 and scope of the care to be provided, and related information 7 shall be disclosed prior to accepting a patient for certified 8 professional midwifery care. The bill provides that qualified members of other 10 professions, including physicians and nurses, are not 11 prevented from providing services consistent with the nature 12 of certified professional midwifery, but these persons shall 13 not use a title or description denoting that they are 14 certified professional midwives. The bill provides that licensed physicians and surgeons, 16 licensed osteopaths, licensed osteopathic physicians and 17 surgeons, licensed nurses, and other licensed health care 18 providers are not liable for acts or omissions of a certified 19 professional midwife when they are providing assistance to the 20 certified professional midwife. Any liability is limited to 21 damages caused by gross negligence or willful or wanton acts 22 or omissions. 23 The bill provides for the appointment of the initial board. 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35
