A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations from the tobacco

2 settlement fund to the Iowa department of public health for

3 health care functions including home health care and public

health nursing services, and providing an effective date and

5 providing for retroactive applicability.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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Section 1. TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND -- APPROPRIATION TO THE 1 2 IOWA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH. There is appropriated from 3 the tobacco settlement fund created in section 12.65 to the 4 Iowa department of public health for the fiscal year beginning 5 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, 6 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose 7 designated: To the Iowa department of public health to be used for core .9 public health functions, including home health care and public 10 health nursing services, contracted through a formula by local 11 boards of health, to enhance disease and injury prevention 12 services: Sec. 2. Section 12.65, Code 1999, is amended to read as: 15 follows: 12.65 TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND. 16 1. A tobacco settlement fund is created in the office of 17 18 the treasurer of state. After payment of litigation costs, 19 the state portion of any moneys paid to the state by tobacco a 20 companies in settlement of the state's lawsuit for recovery of 21 public expenditures associated with tobacco use shall be 22 deposited in the tobacco settlement fund. Moneys deposited in 23 the fund shall be used only as provided in appropriations from ~ 24 the fund to-the-department-of-human-services-for-the-medical 25 assistance-program-and-to-the-Towa-department-of-public-health 26 for health care-related programs to-reduce-smoking-by-teenage 27 youth. For purposes of this section, "litigation costs" are 28 those costs itemized by the attorney general and submitted to 29 and approved by the general-assembly executive council. 30 2. On June 30, 2001, the balance remaining in the tobacco , 31 settlement fund shall be transferred to the general fund of 32 the state. Beginning July 1, 2001, the tobacco settlement 33 fund shall be considered part of the general fund of the

34 state. However, the state portion of the moneys received

35 shall only be appropriated for health care-related programs.

Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. The section in this Act amending 2 section 12.65, being deemed of immediate importance, takes 3 effect upon enactment and is retroactively applicable to July 4 1, 1999.

EXPLANATION

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This bill relates to the tobacco settlement fund, makes appropriations from the fund to the Iowa department of public health, and provides conforming provisions relating to the expenditure of the funds.

The bill appropriates \$1,500,000 to the Iowa department of public health for core public health functions including home leadth care and public health nursing services contracted through a formula by local boards of health to enhance disease and injury prevention services.

The bill also amends codified provisions relating to the 15 16 tobacco settlement fund and to the provisions of the bill. 17 The bill amends Code section 12.65, the tobacco settlement 18 fund, to provide that moneys deposited in the fund shall be 19 used only as provided in appropriations from the fund and for 20 health care-related programs. The amendment to the section 21 also provides that litigation costs, which are to be paid 22 prior to deposit of moneys in the fund, are to be submitted to 23 and approved by the executive council, which as provided in 24 Code section 7D.1 includes the governor, secretary of state, 25 auditor of state, treasurer of state, and the secretary of 26 agriculture. The bill also amends Code section 12.65 to 27 provide that the balance remaining in the tobacco settlement 28 fund shall be transferred to the general fund of the state. 29 Additionally, beginning July 1, 2001, the tobacco settlement 30 fund is to be considered part of the general fund of the 31 state. However, the state portion of the tobacco settlement 32 funds are to continue to only be appropriated for health care-33 related programs. Code section 12.65 as amended in the bill 34 is effective upon enactment and is retroactively applicable to 35 July 1, 1999.
