1 Section 1. TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND -- APPROPRIATION TO THE 2 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. There is appropriated from the 3 tobacco settlement fund created in section 12.65 to the 4 department of human services, for the fiscal year beginning 5 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, 6 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the 7 purposes designated:

14 12.65 TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND.

15 1. A tobacco settlement fund is created in the office of 16 the treasurer of state. After payment of litigation costs, 17 the state portion of any moneys paid to the state by tobacco 18 companies in settlement of the state's lawsuit for recovery of 19 public expenditures associated with tobacco use shall be 20 deposited in the tobacco settlement fund. Moneys deposited in 21 the fund shall be used only as provided in appropriations from 22 the fund to-the-department-of-human-services-for-the-medical 23 assistance-program-and-to-the-Iowa-department-of-public-health 24 for health care-related programs to-reduce-smoking-by-teenage 25 youth. For purposes of this section, "litigation costs" are 26 those costs itemized by the attorney general and submitted to 27 and approved by the general-assembly executive council. 2. On June 30, 2001, the balance remaining in the tobacco 28 29 settlement fund shall be transferred to the general fund of 30 the state. Beginning July 1, 2001, the tobacco settlement 31 fund shall be considered part of the general fund of the 32 state. However, the state portion of the moneys received 33 shall only be appropriated for health care-related programs. 34

34 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. The section in this Act amending 35 section 12.65, being deemed of immediate importance, takes

EXPLANATION

4 This bill relates to the tobacco settlement fund, makes an 5 appropriation from the fund to the department of human 6 services for expansion of the program for school-based 7 supervision of children, and provides conforming provisions 8 relating to the expenditure of the funds.

9 The bill also appropriates \$650,000 to the department of 10 human services to supplement the child and family services 11 appropriation to be used to expand the program for school-12 based supervision of children.

The bill also amends codified provisions relating to the 13 14 tobacco settlement fund and to the provisions of the bill. 15 The bill amends Code section 12.65, the tobacco settlement 16 fund, to provide that moneys deposited in the fund shall be 17 used only as provided in appropriations from the fund and for 18 health care-related programs. The amendment to the section 19 also provides that litigation costs, which are to be paid 20 prior to deposit of moneys in the fund, are to be submitted to 21 and approved by the executive council, which as provided in 22 Code section 7D.1 includes the governor, secretary of state, 23 auditor of state, treasurer of state, and the secretary of 24 agriculture. The bill also amends Code section 12.65 to 25 provide that the balance remaining in the tobacco settlement 26 fund shall be transferred to the general fund of the state. 27 Additionally, beginning July 1, 2001, the tobacco settlement 28 fund is to be considered part of the general fund of the 29 state. However, the state portion of the tobacco settlement 30 funds are to continue to only be appropriated for health care-31 related programs. Code section 12.65 as amended in the bill 32 is effective upon enactment and is retroactively applicable to 33 July 1, 1999.

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
