An officer or employee subject to civil service and 6 7 a chief deputy sheriff or second deputy sheriff, who 8 becomes a candidate for a partisan elective office for 9 remuneration, unless-running-unopposed upon request, 10 shall automatically be given a leave of absence 11 without pay, commencing thirty days before the date of 12 the primary election and continuing until the person 13 is eliminated as a candidate or wins the primary, and 14 commencing thirty days before the date of the general 15 election and continuing until the person is eliminated 16 as a candidate or wins the general election, and 17 during the leave period shall not perform any duties 18 connected with the office or position so held.
